Just when we thought old man winter would not release his grip on us, with snow right through March, Spring has finally arrived. The leaves are on the trees and flowers are out in full force. It has been a beautiful Spring and we are looking forward to summer.

As in previous years the extreme winter weather has left our roads in much need of attention. Your Administration has been looking at available grant monies that can be used to repave our township roads and we have been in contact with our Mahoning County Engineer, Pat Ginnetti to keep him apprised of the conditions of our county roads that need paved. We are finding out that fellow townships trustees are also dealing with potholes and damaged roads that are in dire need of repair. We all are hearing the same message, "that there are nearly 500 miles of county roads in the Mahoning Valley many in need of repaving and that there is not sufficient funds or resources to address the problem". This is not an excuse it's a realty! So, we are trying to look at ways we can improve the situation with limited resources. Your administration met with Engineer, Pat Ginnetti, on May 9th, to go over Coitsville's roads and to discuss what services and resources we can expect from the county this summer. The county has been out filling potholes on our roads and will look at doing some strip paving on our worst roads this summer. In June they will begin mowing the high grass along our roadways. We are thankful for the road resurfacing that was done on North and South Hubbard roads and hope to have other major county roads targeted for resurfacing next year.

Lastly, your Board of Trustees are pleased to announce that the Mahoning County Commissioners, Anthony Traficanti, Carol Rigetti, and David Ditzler will be "going on the road" and will be holding their monthly meeting at the Coitsville Town Hall on September 21, 2018, at 5 pm. Generally, all the county department heads attend this meeting and they and the commissioners will be available to answer any questions our residents may have regarding county services. This will be an ideal time to meet your county officials and bring up issues that are important to our Township. Please plan on attending.

The regular township Board of Trustee meeting will be held immediately following a short social time with our county officials.



Fire Department Faces Crossroad

The Coitsville Fire Department is facing many hurdles to resolve over the next several months. While the department has made several improvements over the last year, there is still much work to be done.

The Fire Department currently has eleven members including the Chief and Chief Brown would like to grow that number by 10 over the next 18 months. The department needs recruits over the age of 18, with a valid Ohio driver's license. The department will provide the necessary training and personal protective equipment the individuals will need. This will cost the township approximately \$5,000.00 per candidate.

The department will need to update their apparatus to meet nationally recognized standards. Recently the department has applied for several grants. Two were Federal Emergency Management Grants, one was for a new pumper engine to replace 1981 engine, which was rejected and the other was for 16 new self-contained breathing apparatus that would replace the current model that the department has which are out dated, this grant is still pending.

Because the department received word that the grant for the new engine was denied. The department will have to attempt to find a used engine to replace the 1981 Engine the department has which no longer passes the annual pump test.

The department has also applied for a Bureau of Worker's Compensation Grant for a new extractor washing machine to clean Personal Protective Equipment (Turnout Gear). New cancer standards require cleaning of gear after each fire. Also, as part of the grant new gloves and Nomex hoods were requested so that members will always have clean gloves and hoods. Research has shown firefighters are at a higher risk of cancer due to the smoke firefighters are required to work in. The Ohio Department of Public Safety also offered a grant for a new computer tablet to enter medical reports. We are awaiting word on the awarding of these grants.

The department continually applies for grants to offset any dollars that the township may have to expend.

After years of watching the front aprons of the fire station break-up due to the increased weight of the fire apparatus. The Board of Trustees approved a bid to replace the current blacktop area with new concrete pads. The approved project will also replace the bad sidewalk into the fire station and make it ADA accessible. The project is expected to be completed by July.

The Department is pleased that the Board of Trustees has approved the bid by Parrella-Pannunzio Construction to install new concrete pads in front of the fire station. The township will secure a loan for this much needed project. The current blacktop in front of the station has broken up and is a safety hazard for personnel. Plans have been being worked on for over one year to bring this project to fruition.

As can be seen by this newsletter article, the members of the fire department are working hard to provide the residents of Coitsville with the best service possible. The department is meeting as many of the mandates and training requirements with the limited resources it has.

The residents are encouraged to visit the fire department on any Tuesday evening and speak to the members and tour the station. Best time is around 6 pm, as we begin training at 6:30 pm. Residents can also call for a scheduled visit.
