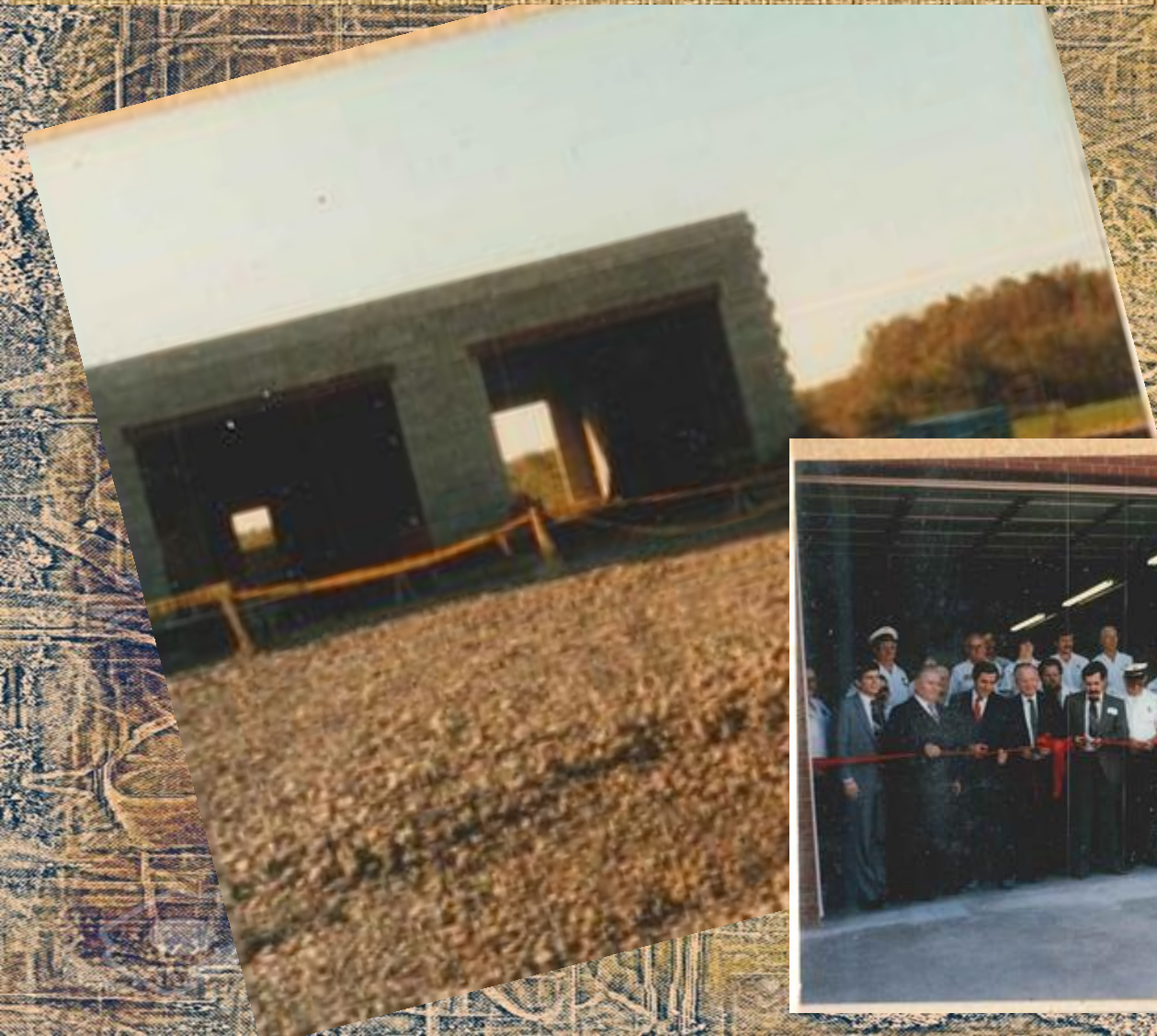

Name Loboy In Coitsville

Coitsville Township trustees elected John Loboy chairman at the reorganization meeting Wednesday night at the township hall.

Loboy, who served as vice chairman last year, and Trustees Louis Pope Jr. and William L. Cowden, who were re-elected in November, were sworn in by County Judge Fred Gough.

Pope was elected vice chairman and Michael G. Tabak was named clerk. Cowden was 1961

John Sinkovich was reappointed fire chief and Frank Behne and John Fabry assistants. The 33 members of the volunteer fire department also were reappointed.

Patrick Paris was renamed chief constable and Philip McMichael was reappointed constable. Ben Hodnicky was renamed zoning inspector.

Sinkovich reported that the fire department answered 17 calls since its formation last April 7. Under the old system of contract with neighboring departments, the calls would have cost \$1,700.

Several recommendations made by Loboy last night will be presented to trustees at the next meeting at 7:30 p.m. Jan. 12.

One call for buying a truck equipped with snow blade. He also suggested the State Highway Department be requested to install turn arrows on the stop lights at Routes 422 and 616.

Also proposed was street lighting of all intersections.

Asks Lower
Speed Limit

Coitsville Township trustees will ask the Ohio Highway Department to reduce the speed limit of U.S. 422 through the township from 80 to 50 m.p.h. to reduce accidents.

Recently elected trustees' chairman John Loboy said the department also will be asked to install turn arrows at the intersection of Routes 422 and 616. Attempts to have the turn arrows installed have been unsuccessful.

Loboy said the township needs more than one full-time deputy but does not have a police levy and is without funds. He said the township gets only \$4.17 returned for each thousand dollars of property valuation.

Trustees, at the recent reorganization meeting, reappointed Ben Hodnicky township deputy sheriff. He will also serve as zoning and building inspector at no additional compensation. An effort will be made to renew a contract with the Mahoning County sheriff's department for police protection.
