## What is the Fourth of July to Blacks?

Many Black Americans, including those realiding in Washington, D.C., appress of lack of resonance with the Fourth of July celebrations. Research indicates that 40% of Black Americans choose not to celebrate this holiday. They believe that the independence and freedom the day signifies haven't been fully realized for Black people in the country. While some Black Washingtonians don't celebrate the Fourth of July in its traditional sense, they might use the day as on opportunity to spend time with family and create memories. Juneteenth, commemorating the emancipation of ensived people in Teocos, signifying a truer sense of the dawn and recognition.





### After Prison, Opportunities Are Hard to Come By. Enter Entrepreneurship.

Formetry incarcerated individuals are 40 percent more likely to pursue entrepreneurality than those without a history of incarceration, finds a new study from keilogics Kylie Hevang and here roouthor Damon Phillips. While entrepreneurship can be lucrative, it is not a oppoular in places with ban-thebox policies–particularly for Stack individuals, who face the highest levels of labor-market discrimination. This suggests that, for those with a record of incarceration, high levels of a entrepreneurship are a reflection of a lack of employment opportunities.

#### Kentucky incarcerates people at a rate higher than all but one country, data shows

Kenucky has one of the highest incarceration rates globaly, surposing all but one county. This alarming trend is highlighted in a recent report by the Prison Policy initiative, which reveals that Kenucky imprisons 888 people per 100,000, a rate higher than most nations. The report emphasizes the urgent need for reform in Kenucky's criminal disproportionately high incarceration rates compared to other states and even countries with authoritarion regimes.
