Welcome to Trinity Episcopal Church for this service of Spiritual Communion and Holy Eucharist. If you're new to the Episcopal Church or to Trinity, we hope you'll feel the love of Christ in and through all those you'll encounter here. If you're returning, we welcome you back. You are invited to participate in this service as much as you are comfortable, by sitting and standing as indicated, and reading the prayers. This service leaflet has page numbers for parts of the service which can be found in the red Book of Common Prayer (BCP). Please take this leaflet with you when you leave.

For the safety of those around you, please remain masked for the duration of the service. Our sanctuary has two sections, one side for those who wish to remain at a 6' distance from other households, and one side where those who are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 can choose to sit together. Communion will be offered this morning (in one kind - bread only), as well as a prayer for Spiritual Communion for those who wish to receive in this manner. Please listen for the announcements preceding communion.

As a final note, this service is being livestreamed on YouTube. Those worshipping in person will be heard throughout the service, but will not be visible to the camera. When communion is being distributed, the camera is turned off for the privacy of those receiving communion. If you have any questions, please be in touch after the service with our camera operator.
