Abuse isn't funny. Not in any way. However, in my own experience, humour is a wonderful coping mechanism and allows me space to heal. The past two years with these incredibly creative humans has been a catharsis—an exorcism of all the years of abuse and oppression we collectively experienced—with the added bonus of intense, delicious laughter. We dragged the dark into the light, dissected it, cried all over it, laughed directly in its face, and then set it on fire. Together we discovered that no one



walks alone, and that it takes a village (and more) to lift each other out of the mire. All of us had had experiences where disempowerment, fear, gaslighting, abuse, and personal danger were the norm, but somehow found our way out-typically with a lot of help from our friends, family, therapists, doctors, support organizations, and our own inner warriors. It's no easy feat, but it is possible.

On the surface, WYRD is the story of one woman finding her path out of the darkness, but it's more than that. It's a celebration of the glorious, nurturing, flatulent, hilarious awesomeness that is sisterhood and community. WYRD is our ode to resilience—a giant group hug for everyone who needs one. Bring it in, folks.

I'm humbled by Britt, Meg, Ashley and Selina's eternally enthusiastic championing of this work, and their collective brilliance. I'm excited by the talented folks who wanted so much to be a part of this project—and came back again and again when I reached out. I'm grateful to everyone who trusted us with funding, residencies, and sponsorships so that we could create in a supported and sustainable way.

I'm so thankful to every person who has contributed their personal stories, passions, humour and pain to the creation of this behemoth (witches of 'The Coven'—I see you!); to everyone who bravely offered us invaluable feedback; and to my eternally patient partner, Andrew, and my wonderful kids, Ella and Forrest—thanks for being my soft place to land.

this project feels like a celebration and validation of this way of working together and it is a rare occurrence in my experience. I am deeply grateful to Kat for her vision in gathering such a dynamic, talented and compassionate team and igniting this project.

For the wyrd in my life who continue to be invisibly powerful, generous, their own kind of punk, resisting and protecting sacred parts of themselves while getting on with it, always, getting on and making shit happen. I am me through you. Full of change and love and courage. I am writing this in the midst of things. I think we are discovering ways in which/witch! we might meaningfully heal and transform—in the process unearthing our care, our humour, our power. Welcome to the Bog. Long live the Bog.

Britt has over 20 years experience as a director, producer, performer, facilitator, storyteller and teacher. She is the Co-Founder and Co-Director of Atomic Vaudeville. The theatre company has created more than 90 original collaborative works including the Zeitgeist Cabaret in Whitehorse in 2019. Britt has directed Janet Munsil's Circus Fire and The Ugly Duchess, Jacob Richmond's Qualities of Zero, National tours of Ride the Cyclone and Legoland, The Fantasticks and True West for Blue Bridge Repertory Theatre, A Midsummer Night's Dream for GVSF, God's Lake and Castle in the Sky for Castlereigh Theatre, Epidermis Circus for SNAFU, My Chernobyl for The Belfry and Gateway Theatre and local Victoria cult hits The Rocky Horror Show and Hedwig for AV. Ashley Robyn | Musical Director

When I was invited to participate in the first development phase of this project as a songwriter 18 months ago, I couldn't have possibly imagined the path that lay ahead. A musical? About abusive relationships and coercive control? How are we going to find our way? I soon discovered, with a group of extraordinary women and non-binary creators, that this path would unfold with a lot more ease than our beloved protagonist. Through shared experiences, laughter,



tears, music, poetry, performance, and collaboration, the journey to the bog had begun.

I was shocked when I was offered the role of musical director and cast member. I haven't been in a play in about twenty years, let alone in a leadership role. But I found myself within a group of incredible, collaborative artists once more. They offered up an abundance of creative energy that I simply poured into the songs and into the process. It was no small feat for this group to approach a highly technical, multi-genre piece. Every day was a new discovery. We also have several performers on instruments they've never played before. I am grateful to them all for getting messy and going into the "vulnerability pit", shining so brightly in that particular darkness. I think you will see that special shine onstage.

I must give my deepest appreciation to Selina Heyligers-Hare, who has been my right hand woman throughout this process. With her prowess for transcription, incredible ear for arrangements, sound design magic, and world class musical abilities, I could not have done it without her. Her graciousness in helping accommodate my dyslexia made this role accessible to me, when for most of my life I figured it would always be out of reach.

And a very special thanks to Britt Small and Kat McCallum, who brought me aboard the Goodship Boghag and changed my horizons for the better.
