HOLD ON TO YOUR SEATS FOLKS, THE LEGISLATURE JUST OPENED THE 2016 SEASON

The Hawaii State Legislature opened on Wednesday, January 20 with a flurry of Legislators and constituents piling into the big square building on Beretania Street to kick off another season of law making. Your Legislative team was at the Capitol to meet and greet Legislators and discuss upcoming issues and proposed bills. We have many energized and supportive law makers that are working with us to maintain our Second Amendment rights and work to improve the way Hawaii's gun owners are treated by the City, County and State in regards to our exercising our Constitutional Rights. I have posted a spread sheet in this newsletter (compiled with the assistance of HRA Member, Jon Lim) to give you an overview of the

enormous number of gun, hunting, mental health, and police power related bills that we are working on this session.

I am going to start out discussing the most ridiculous and overbearing bill we have seen in years. It is SB 3032, which would require firearms owners to obtain special firearms liability insurance. First, this bill would require the DCCA, with the assistance of DPS, to create a firearms insurance program where all firearms owners would be REQUIRED to purchase insurance so we could exercise our Constitutional rights as guaranteed by the Second Amendment.

Second, SB 3032 requests that all firearms be RE-REGISTERED every five years. Re-registration has been found in the Heller 2 case in Washing D.C. to be unconstitutional. You can thank Senator Josh Green for promoting this mess. Please be sure to email or call the Senator and respectfully let him know

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

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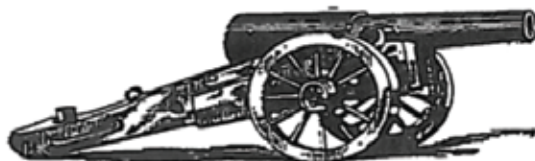

your opinion of this bill. Thus far he has refused to return my calls regarding this bill, hopefully you will have better luck contacting the Senator from District 3, Kona/Kau. He can be reached at (sengreen@capitol.hawaii.gov) or by phone at (808) 586-9385.

Next on the horrendous list is SB 2413, which seeks to disqualify any person listed on the Terrorist Screening Database from owning, possessing or controlling a firearm or ammunition, and including seizure of all firearms and ammunition in that persons possession or collection. While, on the face of this bill, it seems like a good idea to ban actual terrorists from possessing firearms, on further investigation it becomes onerous.

For instance, how does a person get added to that list? There seems to be no stated criteria to cause your name to be added to the list, there is NO DUE PROCESS for your name to be added. Getting your name off the list when it has been added erroneously is extremely difficult, often requiring years of diligent work to get your name cleared, and meanwhile, your firearms have been confiscated. This is clearly unconstitutional confiscation, which is a very hot topic nationwide right now with police and government confiscations coming under heavy scrutiny.

SB 2813: Seeks to have the courts report information about adult guardianships to the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center and to the FBI for "gun control purposes." We have seen this kind of overreaching in the Veteran's Administration where they wanted to take guns away from perfectly sound individuals because they had a relative or a close friend handling the receipt of their retirement funds and the payment of their guns. If a person is adjudicated with a mental deficiency that endangers others, then we all agree that they should not be in possession of guns, but having your son or daughter help with payment of your bills does not cancel your Constitutional rights.

HB 2273 & SB 2802: Requires hunters to have WRITTEN PERMISSION from land owners to hunt on their property or property that they control. We will keep a close eye on this one and try to figure out what is driving this one.

HB 2425 Concealed Carry: Requires each County Police Chief to adopt criteria for the approval or denial of concealed weapon license applications

and requires that an applicant be informed of the specific reason for a denial, and requires annual reports. We like this concept, except that this must be a standardized, STATE-WIDE process, not done individually by each county. The Hawaii Revised Statutes requires that the applications and processing be standardized on a state-wide basis. (SB1184). This was submitted by our very own Senator Sam Slom. Please support, whether you intend to carry or not. It is our right to have this legalized in Hawaii.

HB 519 & HB 1754 & SB 2646 Apprentice Hunting License: We strongly support this to allow children ages 10 to 17 and adults to get an apprentice hunting license that allows them to be introduced to hunting by a licensed adult. This bill will allow for many more people to be introduced to the sport of hunting. Please support these bills.

HB 1041 - HD1 Game Commission: This is an incredibly important bill this year to create a Game Commission, which will be advisory to the DLNR on all issues regarding hunting in the State of Hawaii. It will create a Commission with a member from each of the islands except Kaho'olawe, which is unoccupied. The commissioners will meet to decide what needs to be done to improve the hunting environment and then report those findings to the DLNR for implementation. One of the critical issues to be dealt with is the aircraft eradication of game mammals on several of our islands. This should only be permitted when allowing hunters to control mammal populations is too dangerous or the areas are not reachable by hunters. The Game Commission will have a very positive impact on this issue.

Your Association is watching the bills move through the House and the Senate and is testifying where we feel we need to influence the outcome. We will be asking you to participate, when necessary. If you receive an ALERT from us via email, please click on the alert and follow the instructions on the ALERT to post testimony on the bills. You will need to create an account with your email address and a password of your choosing, but after that it only takes a few seconds to submit the testimony. In many cases it only needs to be the checking of a box indicating that you are in favor of the measure or opposed.

Please stay tuned as we work our way through the session.

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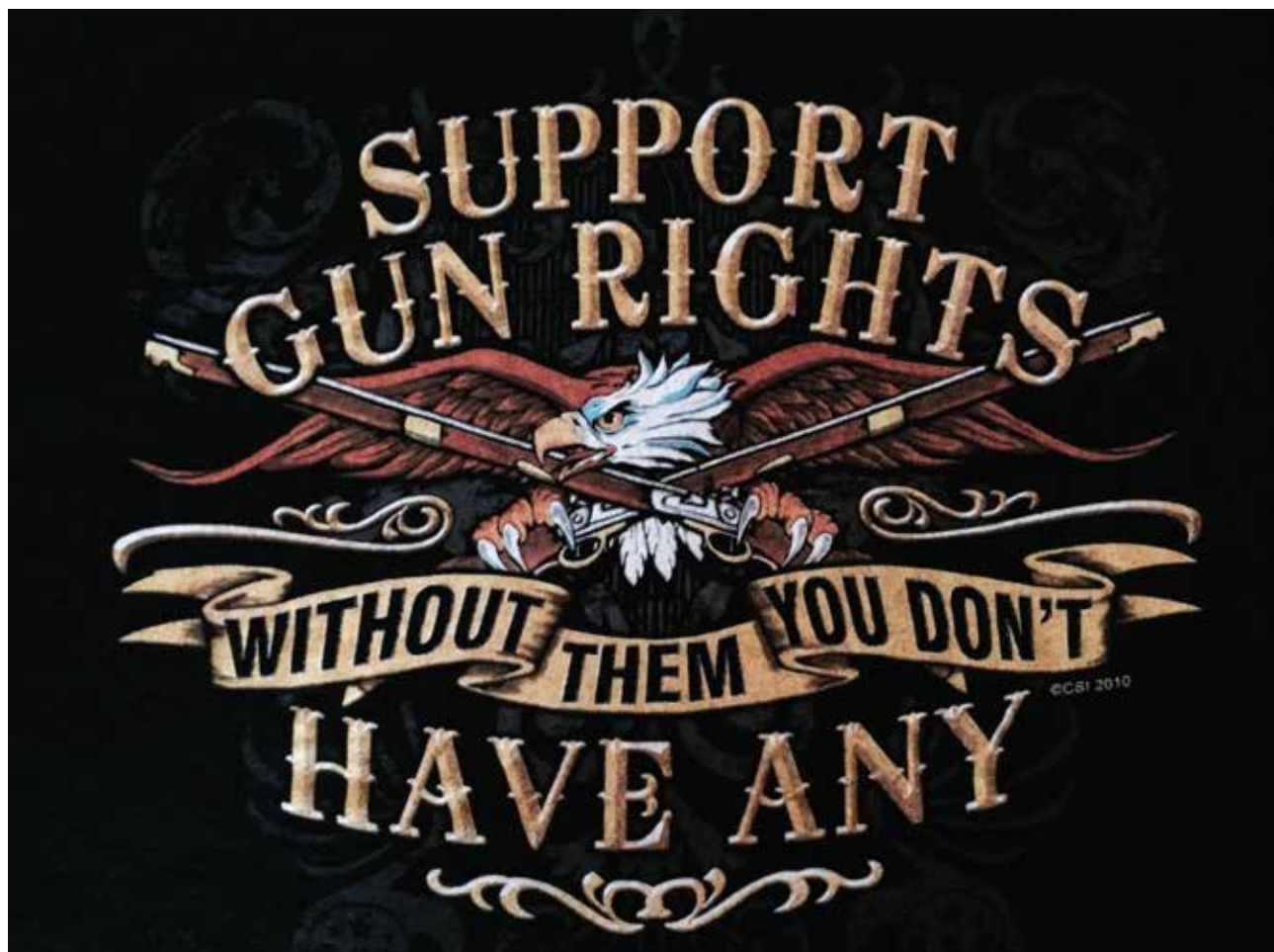
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Obituary
