## President's Message March 2016

Your gun rights are about to slip away into oblivion if Representative Karl Rhodes has his way in the Legislature this year. Rep Rhodes has pushed a pile of anti-gun bills through the House despite all of our efforts to block these bad bills, which included a large volume of written testimony from our loyal members and our oral testimony in the Hearings. It's crunch time ladies and gentlemen, these bills have crossed over to the Senate for hearings in the Senate Public Safety Committee, chaired by Senator Clarence Nishihara

and Vice Chair Will Espero

imperative that you email both of these Senators to let them know that you STRONGLY OPPOSE the following bills:

**HB 625 (HD1):** Misdemeanor stalking and sexual assault. While we do not support stalking or sexual assault, this

bill is poorly crafted and will allow a person to lose their firearm rights for nothing more than authoring and sending an unwanted text, email, fax, or even making a phone call. This bill must be stopped, or radically altered to protect against the above noted faults.

**HB 626 (HD1):** Consuming alcohol while in possession of a firearm. HD1 altered the original bill to limit to outside the home. While an improvement, it does not provide any quantification of impairment, like driving under the influence does in current statutes. This would bar a person from having a glass of wine with dinner once we secure Concealed Carry in Hawaii and would have criminal ramifications for those individuals convicted.

**HB 2629 (HD2):** RAP BACK. This would enter EVERY applicant for a Permit To Acquire a firearm into a National Criminal Monitoring system so HPD can monitor all arrests of Hawaii's citizens in the other 49 states AND charge you a tax on your Second Amendment rights

of about \$50. If HPD thinks this is such an important bill, then they should pay the fee themselves. The Legislature would never fund this bill, so why should we?

**HB 1813 (HD1):** TERRORIST WATCH LIST. Anyone who appears on the Federal Terrorist watch list CANNOT acquire firearms. Sounds logical on the front end, right? Unfortunately, the Federal Auditor found that the error rate on this list exceeded 38% and an innocent person will find it next to impossible to get their name removed from the list. BAD BILL.

Along with the above "Bad Bills" are some "Good Bills" that deserve our support, they are as follows:

**SB 2026 (SD2):** APPRENTICE HUNTING. This bill allows for new hunters from age 10 to 17 years of age to hunt with a Licensed Hunter to discover the sport. And, if they want to continue beyond age 17, they would be required to take the Hunters Safety class and pay the standard fee for a license. We support this to bring new hunters into the fold and promote the sport.

**HB 1041 (HD2):** This bill would create a statewide GAME COMMISSION to advise DLNR on all issues surrounding hunting. This is long overdue in Hawaii and will give hunters a voice with the government.

A problematic bill, which we do not oppose, but recommend should be revised is:

**SB 2802 (SD1):** Requires ALL HUNTERS to have WRITTEN PERMISSION to hunt on private land. While the intention of the bill is to protect the rights of land owners to protect their property from trespassers and poachers, it is problematic that property lines are not painted on the trees and bushes in our beautiful forests, so being sure you are on a certain property is very difficult. Secondly, if this moves forward, after-the-fact written permission should be added to the bill.

We're halfway through the session now and need your attention more than ever. Please keep up the support to protect our fragile Second Amendment rights in Hawaii. We also recommend that you contact your district Senator and Representative and let them know your concerns about these bad bills. This is an election year and they need to know you're watching how they treat your Second Amendment rights. We need to stop these bad bills from advancing, before it's too late.
