Friends of the NRA Gives Kaiser Air Riflery a Much Needed Boost

In 2015, James Olson and I (his wife) took on coaching the Kaiser Air Rifle team. We jumped in with our eyes closed and huge leap of faith. Kaiser High School did not have a team for the past two years and we were brand new to the sport. Boy, did we have a lot to learn.

As soon as we were given the keys, we took inventory. It didn't take long. One small gun safe, ten Daisy 753 Rifles, two boxes of targets and two boxes of pellets, and \$185.00 in the school's riflery account. That was it.

James got in touch with Mid-Pac Gun Club and with Yuji and Robynn Hata's expertise, he learned the basics of shooting. Dawn Horn helped out by informing us about Coaches Shooting Camp. We spent the summer making homemade rifle stands, kneeling rolls, target stands and refurbishing the Daisy's. When we opened our doors, twenty-eight students and their parents walked into our first meeting. Wow, it was overwhelming. May I add that we had no scopes whatsoever. The Hata's generously let us borrow binoculars and the team had to share amongst themselves. Crazy, right? Nonetheless, we made it through the first season with a 4-4 record for the boys and a 1-9 record for the girls. It was a great first season, our team members were real troopers and the parent support was amazing.

After the end of the season, we applied for the Friends of the NRA grant.

Early in 2016, we were awarded \$9,995.00 from the Friends of the NRA. We sincerely cannot be more grateful. With the funds, we were able purchase rifle stands, off hand stands, kneeling rolls, scopes and yes, eight new Crosman Challengers. It was a dream-come-true moment for Kaiser Air Riflery.

As the 2016 season rolled around, with new equipment and a year of experience on the books, it was off to the races for our team. Our boys finished with a 4-4 record with an average of 100 points added to their total score.

Our girls did better than that. They improved to 4-4 as well, but added 350 - 400 points to their overall score! We also sent two star shooters, Taylor Dunaway and Landon Murai, to OIA Championships and they both qualified for States. We couldn't be prouder. We are excited to see what 2017 brings.

We have found the Air Riflery community to be extremely supportive and encouraging. Without which, we don't know how we could ever survive. A Big Mahalo to Dawn Horn, and all of the OIA and ILH coaches whom we have called in desperation. Lastly and most importantly - the Friends of the NRA for getting us to where we are now and helping us provide a solid foundation from which to develop, grow and succeed.

We amended the By Laws to allow Permanent Resident Aliens to become members to of HRA. This was necessary because they are allowed firearm ownership and possession throughout the country and in Hawaii, so we wanted to welcome them to membership.

Coming up on September 16 and 17 is the DLNR Hunting and Fishing Days event at the Kokohead Shooting Complex. This event features .22 L.R. pistols and rifles, run by the HRA, center fire rifles and pistols run by various other clubs, trap, archery, and even a casting venue where you can learn to cast a fishing lure, or learn to do it better. It is an event that benefits the Food Bank of Hawaii, so bring lots of non-perishable food goods (canned goods), which you can trade in for scrips to use at all the different venues. Koko Head Skeet Club (KHSC)

Hi Shooters:

Laughlin here to welcome you back to Koko Head Skeet Club. It's been a long time since we have had the opportunity to touch bases with the shooting public. Our year has come to an end with this last official tournament of the year. It was a busy one with lots of hot weather to contend with that made shooting a little uncomfortable and we were complaining of the heat and humidity. To put it into perspective, all we have to do is think of all the people in Texas and Florida in the last few weeks and our weekend was definitely "Paradise" compared to what has happened in that part of our country. Our thoughts and prayers go out to the people who lost not only loved ones, but have so much recovery to piece back their communities and lives. I can't imagine a more devastating set of events affecting so many people and in such a short period of time. Gives one pause....

Back to the skeet annual tourney--two days of shooting, Saturday the 100 target 20 ga. event followed by 50 targets of .410, with Sunday rounding out our shooting weekend with 100 targets 12 ga. event, followed by 50 targets doubles. It was a full weekend with good participation this year.

Saturday, we had a total of 19 shooters show up for the 20 ga. and it was Chad Sims (Class AA) shooting the high score of the day of 97. We had two shooters with 93's, Eric Vanbergeijk (Class AA) and Mike Cullen (Class E). Several other shooters were right up there in the 90's.

Following the 20 ga. event we had the .410 event, 15 shooters participating. The .410 mind you is called the "experts" gauge because there is only a 1/2 ounce of shot in the shell so it can be a challenge to be proficient with the .410. We had 50 targets in this event and the high score of the day came from Tai Chong (Class C) with a 46 out

of 50, who won in a shoot off against Mike Cullen with a similar score of 46. Mike went to first place after Tai, and Chad Sims came up 2nd with a score of 45. Congrats guys on job well done.

On Sunday we had the 12 ga. event followed by the 50 doubles. We had 19 shooters show up to do battle with the elements and each other. In the 12 ga. event we had none other than Eric Vanbergeijk come in with the high score of 98. Imagine that, only two targets lost in the 100 target event, great shooting Eric. He was followed by Chad Sims with a 97, showing great consistency as it was the same score he shot in 20 ga. Great job to the top two finishers. This was followed by the 50 target doubles and here we see a familiar face as Tai Chong came out on top with single miss to bring in the bacon at 49. Watching Tai shoot doubles was absolute smoothness and he was just the one shy to make a perfect round. Second high score of the day came from Alden Almeida (Class D) with 47. Great job guys on a job well done.

Well, now comes the part that the stats guys just love...who were the overall winners of the day. High Overall (HOA) for the tournament is the addition of the high raw scores of the 20 ga. and 12 ga. events only--and the winner is...none other than Chad Sims with both events shooting 97 for a raw score of 194 of 200. Since he was HOA he cannot place in the class categories. The next category is the High Overall Handicap winner and this is the raw score plus your handicap targets (Handicap targets for each class is Class E-12, Class D-10, Class C-8, Class B-6, Class A-4, and Class AA-2) and each person who makes a 100 total is entitled to shoot off with similar 100 handicap winners. Only one person in both the 20 ga. and 12 ga. event made handicap and it was none other than one of the old timers Neal Yoshimura (Class E)--congrats on some great shooting. For the .410 event, it was Tai Chong with HOA with a 46, followed by Mike Cullen in 1st place with 46 and Chad Sims in 2nd with a 45. For the Doubles event, it was Tai Chong again HOA with a blazing 49, followed by Alden Almeida in 1st place with 47 and Shane Nakata (Class D) 2nd place with 41. 
