40-hour course designed for patrol officers, investigators, crime prevention personnel, and individuals in fields related to ag security that want to develop an expertise in the area of rural crime. Students will learn skills necessary for effective rural crime prevention, reporting, interdiction, and investigation through lectures and excercises in the field.

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This is a 40-hour course designed for patrol officers, investigators, crime prevention personnel, and individuals in fields related to ag security to develop an expertise in rural crime in California or other locations. The student will learn skills necessary for effective rural crime prevention, reporting, interdiction, and investigation. The course includes a wide variety of topics (see next page for agenda) with lecture-related field exercises and role-playing. Related law enforcement professionals are invited to attend. This class is not P.O.S.T. certified and is open to individuals and companies in the private ag security sector in addition to law enforcement. We welcome out-of-state student participation.

## \$400 - TASK FORCE MEMBER

#### \$450 - NON-TASK FORCE MEMBER

Includes a one-year, \$100 membership fee for your agency. Maximum of \$100 per agency, per year, for unlimited students.

## \$500 - NON-RESIDENT

No membership required for students outside of California.

#### **REQUIRED EQUIPMENT**

Students will be working in close proximity to livestock and heavy farm and construction equipment; and as such, should wear appropriate shoes/boots and clothing. Hats and sun screens are recommended for on-site visits.
