



# Summer Camp Guidelines

**Cast Expectation:** All campers and interns will be expected to follow the guidelines set forth by Parkway Players. They should do their best at the role assigned and accept that every part is important. They should work hard and remain respectful to all involved, understanding the directors have the right to remove them from the camp without a refund if they choose not to follow the guidelines and expectations including dress code and attendance guidelines. Here are the 3 big rules:

- 1. Be Safe follow dress code, no horseplay, remain in designated areas of church
- 2. Be Respectful follow directions, be kind to everyone, be on time, no gossip
- 3. Be Responsible bring your script, stay off your phone, learn your parts

**Attendance:** Regular and punctual attendance is vital for every camper. Please make every effort to arrive at camp each day on time. We do know that emergencies and family needs will arise; if your child will miss a camp day or be late, please let us know as soon as possible.

**Dress Code:** Dress for camp should be modest and comfortable. There will be dancing involved, so tennis shoes or jazz shoes should be worn. **No flip-flops or crocs please.** For the performances, each camper will receive a t-shirt that should be worn with jeans or black leggings/jazz pants.

#### **Tuition:**

- \$275 camp tuition which covers t-shirt and all materials.
- 10% discount for active church members of Parkway Church or currently enrolled students of Parkway Christian Academy
- 5% Sibling discount for non-members (cannot combine with other discounts)
- Invoices will be emailed, and can be paid via credit card, check, or cash.

### **Summer Camp Schedule:**

## Monday – Wednesday, June 30 – July 2:

*9:00 am:* Campers should enter through entrance 2 each morning and report to the choir room. Doors will automatically lock at 9:15.

We will have various activities throughout the day including: singing, choreography, acting games, crafts, and showcase rehearsals.

12:00 – 12:30 – Lunch break. Campers should bring a sack lunch each day.

3:00 pm: Dismissal will take place at the North Entrance. Parents should form a pick-up line and drive through the covered driveway at Entrance 1.

## Performance Day - Thursday, July 3:

*9:00 am:* Campers should come in camp t-shirt. We will have a full day of camp as normal. We will keep the students until the performance, so there will not be a normal dismissal.

12:00 – 12:30 – Lunch break. Campers should bring a sack lunch each day.

3:00 – We will NOT have dismissal today, but will have a special snack for the campers and prepare for our performance. Campers will stay until performance.

*5:30 pm:* Camp showcase performance in auditorium. Campers will be dismissed to parents after the performance.

**Materials:** Each camper will receive a printed copy of the music/script. This is theirs to keep, so they should feel free to highlight parts and take notes during rehearsals.

#### What to Bring:

- Script & pencil
- Water we do have a bottle refill fountain
- Snacks we will take short snack breaks in the morning and afternoon
- Sack Lunch we will have a 30-minute lunch break each day

**Tickets:** General admission tickets will be available at the door 30 minutes before the showcase. All tickets will be \$5, and seating will be on a first come, first served basis. Each family will be issued 2 complimentary tickets.

**Volunteer Opportunities:** We know not all parents are available to help during summer camp. If you are able and willing, we would greatly appreciate any assistance in the following areas:

- Morning Activities Monitors: we will break into age-appropriate groups for improv games and crafts. All activities will be planned, but extra help facilitating the activities would take place in the choir room, fellowship hall, or auditorium.
- Lunch Monitor: Help monitor kids while they eat lunch from 12:00 12:30 and help clean up the fellowship hall after.
