

Privacy Statement

Privacy is a key underpinning of our ethical framework. The Social Safety Initiative takes your privacy personally, and we are delighted that you have taken the time to read about our practices. This statement describes what we collect, how we collect it, what we do with it and under what circumstances we might share it. This statement is applicable to our website, and information collected through our website. We provide privacy notices regarding our services to our clients. This is also available upon request.

The Social Safety Initiative respects you, and your privacy, and believes that information about you and about your behavior belongs to you.

Personal Data

Personal Data includes any information about you that can be associated with you, such as your name and contact information, or information about your individual use of the site.

Data you share with us

We collect personal data about you with your permission, when you share it with us, and we use it only for the purposes for which it was shared. We recognize your right to control your personal data and will remove or delete any personal data upon request. ([please see process for data deletion below.](#))

Data we collect automatically

The Social Safety Initiative does not collect personal data by default. This site and associated sites does not use google analytics or any other service that collects data about you or your use of this site. Aggregate Data

The Social Safety Initiative may collect aggregate data about our website visitors in order to help us understand how these visitors are using our website, such as the number of visitors per month to our website, browser types, and other general information. However, none of this information can be associated with individuals.

We collect this information to help us ensure that our website is meeting the needs of our visitors, and that our services are working as intended.

Data Sharing with Third Parties

The Social Safety Initiative does not share, rent, sell, hint, leak, sneak, treat or in any other manner oblique imbue third parties with the power of your personal data without your explicit consent, even under duress. Not even if they can pull this sword out of this stone right here.

We use your data only for the purposes for which it was intended, and only with your permission.

The Social Safety Initiative is aware of what happens to snitches. However, on rare occasions, we may share information, if compelled to do so, with law enforcement or other recognized authorities. In these instances, we will require a subpoena or court order before we will allow disclosure of any kind.

Compliance

The Social Safety Initiative is a firm believer that *if you stay ready, you ain't got to get ready*. We are prepared to comply with privacy laws nationally and globally because of our “minimalist” approach to data collection, and our “maximalist” approach to data subject rights and data control.

The Social Safety Initiative does not:

- Collect any personal data without consent
- Process any personal data without consent
- Rely on any “opt-out” or “implied opt-in” personal data collection methods
- Share data with any third party without explicit consent
- Sell any data to third parties

The Social Safety Initiative does:

- Provide an immediate mechanism to unsubscribe from emails
- Delete all contact information on request
- Store data securely
- Follow best practices for data privacy and security
- Acknowledge data subject rights

Statement of CCPA compliance

The Social Safety Initiative is not subject to the California Consumer Privacy act because we do not meet the definition of a “business” under the following criteria:

- Has annual gross revenues of at least 25 million USD per year,
- Annually buys, sells, receives, or shares personal information from at least 50,000 consumers, households, or devices, or
- Makes over 50 percent of its gross annual revenue from selling personal information

In any event: we do not process personal information without the express consent of the data subject, and we do not share personal information with third parties without express consent.
