#### "GRACE OF GODDESS LAKSHMI"





The Keshav Memorial Educational Society has conducted an Auspicious Event of celebrating the "VARALAKSHMI VRATAM" which is dedicated to Goddess Lakshmi, the Goddess of wealth and prosperity. This day is observed every year on Ekadashi Tithi (Friday) of Shukla Paksha in the auspicious Hindu calendar month of Sawan/Shravanam Month.

Keshav Memorial Educational Society has organized this auspicious Varalakshmi Vratam by consecrating the idol of Goddess Lakshmi in the middle of the hall, and performed the Vratam (Pooja) with the help of a Poojari (A hindu priest) who has explained the significance along with chanting mantras. This auspicious Vratam then continued with a miniature version of Vratam (pooja) done by all the students of Keshav Memorial Educational Society and everyone attained the grace of Goddess Lakshmi while fulfilling the Vratam by having homemade Prashad, hereby, received blessings, and prosperity.

#### **Mythological Backdrop:**

The word "Varalakshmi" has its genesis from the Sanskrit language that is "Vara" indicates "Boon" and the word "Lakshmi" indicates "Wealth". One of the most interesting mythological stories tells the people about the significance of "Varalakshmi Vratam", in short, there existed a kingdom called Kundinagaram, town in the Vidarbha kingdom, and lived a woman named "Charumati", where she was pious and always indulges herself in the prayers of Maa Lakshmi, subsequently, Maa lakshmi appeared in her dream and instructed her to perform the Varalakshmi Vrata. The next day, all other women went to temple, and recited the mantra, tied the nine threads known as "Thoranam" on her wrist, offered Naivedyam (Prashad) and completed the procedure. Finally, the whole town was blessed with enormous wealth. Since then, Varalakshmi Vratam has been performed by Hindu women across India.

To sum up, the auspicious Varalakshmi Vratam is a way of attaining the grace of Goddess Lakshmi, where it has been an honor for the Keshav Memorial Educational Society to perform the Vratam and attain her grace.



JURISDICTION - authority to hear and decide cases




