
Set Time to Pray!

GOD LOVES HEARING FROM US!

God is speaking. The question is – are we listening?

Read these Bible verses: 1 Kings 19:11–14! God often speaks with us through His "still small voice," but we need to take a break from all the sound around us to hear God's voice clearly.



GIVE IT ALL TO GOD IN PRAYER!

You can bring a heart of gratitude to God in prayer. You can tell the Lord what you're thankful for. Don't forget to remember the little things that are going well for you. The little things in life are as significant as the big things in life. Let's be a good steward of everything God has given us, and let's place value on both the big and little things! (Psalms 100:4)

You can tell God about how you feel physically or emotionally. God knows we are weak, but God promises to be our ultimate strength (Psalm 28:7). You can present your requests and needs to God. He is more than delighted to guide your path and to give you what's best for you in every endeavour of your life. (Philippians 4:6-7).

GOD SPEAKS THROUGH HIS CHILDREN!

Now there was a certain disciple at Damascus named Ananias; and to him the Lord said in a vision, "Ananias." And he said, "Here I am, Lord." So the Lord said to him, "Arise and go to the street called Straight, and inquire at the house of Judas for one called Saul of Tarsus, for behold, he is praying. And in a vision he has seen a man named Ananias coming in and putting his hand on him, so that he might receive his sight."

Then Ananias answered, "Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much had m he has done to Your saints in Jerusalem. And here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who call on Your name."

Set Time to Pray!

Prayer does not always need to be structured, however if you're finding it challenging to spend time in prayer with the Lord, this timetable may support you to set a consistent time for prayer and for reading the Scripture each day!

Note: Even though this structure is aimed for your morning time in prayer, I would totally encourage you to spend time in prayer before you sleep too.

It will support you to start your day and to conclude your day in the right way.

Don't forget that God hears your smallest whispers too. So call upon Him any time of the day and He will always step in to help you.

Spending One Hour in Prayer and Reading the Bible may look like this:

NOTE: Remove the distractions!

Yes, that means even your phone if it's getting in the way!

5 Minutes: Pray and ask God to help you understand His Word (The Bible)

20 Minutes: Read the Bible (Either a Passage or a Whole Chapter)

Meditate on what the Scripture means. Keep context in mind. You can

even write notes in a Journal regarding what God has spoken.

Spend time in Prayer. Tell God what you're grateful for. Make your requests

known to God and give Him your burdens.

5 Minutes: Listen to what God is speaking.



A Timetable to Pray!

Remember your quality of time in prayer is more important than the quantity of time you spend in prayer. it is most important that you approach your time of prayer, including the reading of the Scriptures with a genuine heart. Sometimes setting more time to pray and read the Bible may be important because we may feel more relaxed to rest in God's presence, instead of rushing through our prayers.

Note: Even though this structure is aimed for your morning time in prayer, I would totally encourage you to spend time in prayer before you sleep too.

It will support you to start your day and to conclude your day the right way. Don't forget that God hears your smallest whispers too. So call upon Him any time of the day and He will always step in to help you.

Spending 30 Minutes in Prayer and Reading the Bible may look like this:

10 Minutes: Read the Bible (Eiither a Passage or a Whole Chapter)

Spend time in Prayer. Tell God what you're grateful for. Make your requests

known to God and give Him your burdens.

3 Minutes: Listen to what God is speaking.
