**\*\*\*Chaplain's Message\*\*\***

My Brother Knights, hopefully the month of April will finally bring us some warm weather. It also brings us to the holiest time of the year in the Church. We will be celebrating Holy Week beginning on Palm Sunday—Passion Sunday on the 14th of the month.

*Holy Week* is the most sacred time when we celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. *Palm Sunday* marks the beginning of Holy Week. On Palm Sunday we recall our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem with the cheers of the people and the palms they waved as he entered.

In the reading of the Passion of our Lord from St. Luke's Gospel, we see how the same people who waved the palms on Palm Sunday cried out crucify him, crucify him, on Good Friday. What a special time this is for us as we recall and share in the Paschal Mystery of Christ.

**The Holy Tridium**

My brothers in the Holy Tridium: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday, we participate in Christ's suffering, His death and His resurrection. Each of the special days enables us to enter more deeply into the Paschal Mystery of Christ.

On *Holy Thursday* we share in the Mass of the Lord's Supper. At this mass Jesus instituted the gift of the Holy Eucharist in which we get to share His Body and Blood. He also instituted the Priesthood when he told his apostles, "Do this in memory of me." In many parishes it is at this mass that the priests renew their commitment to the priesthood. In the washing of the feet we experience Christ's call to all of us to serve one another.

On *Good Friday* we celebrate the Passion of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. The *Good Friday Service* has three parts: The Liturgy of the Word, The Veneration of the Cross, and the reception of Communion. The Liturgy of the Word includes the reading of the Passion of the Lord from St. John's Gospel. This is followed by the Solemn Veneration of the Cross. The Cross is the symbol of Christ's sacrifice and victory for each of one of us. We are invited to venerate the cross by kissing the cross. Finally, the service concludes with the reception of Holy Communion from the Eucharist that was consecrated on Holy Thursday.

On *Holy Saturday* we have the Easter Vigil. On this night we celebrate Christ's triumphant resurrection. This service has four parts: The Blessing of the Easter Fire, the Liturgy of the Word, Blessing of the Easter Water and renewal of Baptismal Vows, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

We begin with the *Blessing and Lighting of the Easter Fire*, which symbolizes the light returning to the world because of Jesus. We then bless and consecrate the Paschal Candle, the symbol of Christ's Resurrection and light in the world.

We then listen to the story of Salvation History in the *Liturgy of the Word*. We have the consecration of the Easter Water. We all renew our Baptismal Vows and are sprinkled with the new Easter Water. The Easter Vigil concludes with the *Liturgy of the Eucharist*.

On *Easter Sunday* we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus, we renew our Baptismal Promises, and we are sprinkled with the new Easter Water as a reminder of our Baptism.

I hope that each of you is taking advantage of the Penitential Season of Lent to avail yourselves of the great Sacrament of Reconciliation. For the Season of Lent we are invited to look in to our spiritual lives to see if we are following the Lord and living as his disciples.

### **Sacrament of Reconciliation**

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is readily available to all. All the parishes have confessions scheduled at regular times and your priests will see you at special times if you can't make the regular time. And don't forget that the parishes in the area come together for a Deanery Penance Service. It will be held on Monday, April 8, at 7:30 p.m. at Our Lady Mother of the Church, Woodcliff Lake. There is no better way celebrate the Season of Lent and prepare for Easter than to receive Jesus' gift of reconciliation. 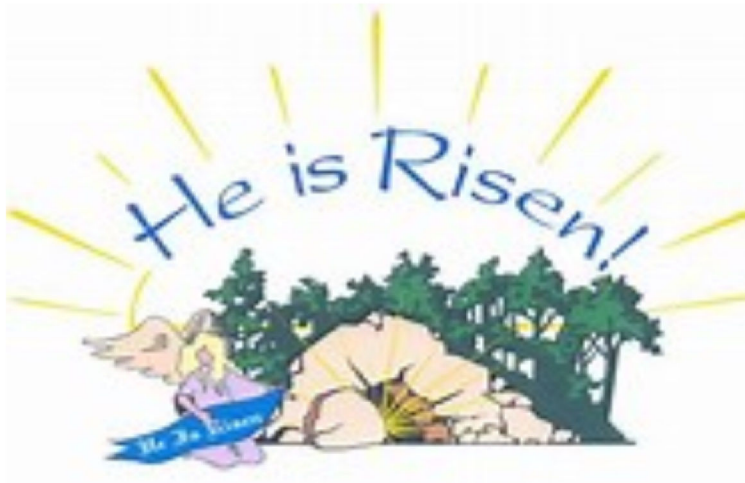

The Grand Knight will return the salute and acknowledge the member. All questions and speech are directed through the chair.

There may be other situations that arise that are not covered by a rule. But by applying common courtesy to each other, we cannot go wrong. Finally, we should show proper consideration for the office represented by the person.
