There is no better way to celebrate the Season of Lent and prepare for Easter than to receive Jesus' gift of reconciliation. As I have done in previous years, I offer a prayer for you and your family to say before meals for the season of Lent:

Lenten Grace before Meals

As we look at the blessings of this food and drink spread before us in this meal, O Lord, we find ourselves grateful to you as well for opening our eyes to your plan of salvation revealed to us in Jesus, your Son. Open the eyes of our hearts this season as we draw closer to you through prayer and worship and Holy Scripture. Bless our family and this food we are about to receive from your bounty, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

My brothers I hope that each of us will use this Holy Season of Lent to grow in our spirituality, in your discipleship, and in our commitment to being good Knights of Columbus.

May God grant each you a Season of Spiritual Growth this Lent.

<u>ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK – 2019 LENTEN</u> REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one full meal is permitted and two smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 10, 2019, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 16, 2019.

*Canon 920, 1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

There are many Catholic Veterans in the residence at the Paramus Veterans Home. Several of them are disabled and need assistance in getting from their quarters to the location where the Mass is celebrated and after the Mass to return to their quarters. More Knights are needed to provide this assistance, since the health and physical capacities of many of the long-timers precludes them from providing this act of charity.

This is an informal process, just show up at the Paramus Veterans Home and lend a hand pushing a wheelchair. Eucharistic ministers are also urgently needed.



The scholarship committee of Knights of Columbus Mother Seton Council #5427 will again award three scholarships from the James Picarella Memorial Trust Fund and one Mother Seton Scholarship. Each scholarship is for \$1,000.

Applicants for the Picarella Scholarship must be graduating high school this year and must be residents of the Township of Washington. Non-residents who have a father, brother, or grandfather as a member in good standing of Mother Seton Council #5427 for at least one year prior to the date of the application may also apply.

Applicants for the Mother Seton Scholarship may be a member of the council or be related to a council member in good standing. They may be high school seniors or enrolled in any continuing educational program, but not extending beyond a bachelor's degree.

Following are the principal criteria for selecting the winners:

- 1. The award must be applied toward tuition for a full-time student at any accredited institution of higher education: college, business, nursing, or technical school.
- 2. The award will be in one payment to the student upon proof of enrollment.
- 3. While scholastic ability is of great importance, we will also consider financial need, community involvement, and extracurricular activities.
- 4. The application must be completed by the student in its entirety. Leave no blanks. If something does not apply, please state that fact. A high school transcript must accompany the completed application. An incomplete application will be disqualified.

Applications are available at the Westwood High School and Immaculate Heart Academy Guidance Offices, the school websites, and the Knights of Columbus Council. Completed applications must be in a sealed envelope addressed to Mr. Paul Elterlein, Scholarship Chairman, Knights of Columbus, 79 Pascack Road, Twp. of Washington 07676, no later than May 15, 2021. If you have any questions, call Mr. Elterlein at 201-265-1749. The scholarships will be awarded at the Awards Night Meeting, Thursday, May 27, 2021.

The Knights of Columbus was founded in 1882 at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut, by Fr. Michael J. McGivney. It is the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization with nearly 1.9 million members worldwide. It is also one of the most active charitable organizations in the United States. In the past year, the organization raised more than \$4.4 million for Christian and other religious minority refugees in the Middle East. The Knights also set new records in fiscal year 2020 for charitable giving with donations of \$185.7 million and 76.7 million hours of hands-on service to charitable causes. In calendar year 2020, Mother Seton Council contributed \$68,785 to charities and awarded \$4,000 in scholarships.
