Brother Knights, I hope you had a joyful celebration of Thanksgiving with your families. I hope that you like me enjoyed seeing your family and sharing a Thanksgiving meal with them. We must always stay close to our families and help them grow in their faith by our love and example. As we begin the month of December, we enter that wonderful time of preparation of our hearts, our minds, our homes, and our community to the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

We prepare for the celebration of his coming on the first Christmas Day, which marked the beginning of his mission of salvation and redemption for the whole world. More importantly, we are preparing the world for his second coming at the end of the world to judge the living and the dead. The two Seasons of Advent and Christmas bring together the unfolding story of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, coming into the world to give himself for us, our forgiveness, our redemption, and our salvation.

#### Advent Season

On Sunday, December 1, we begin the Season of Advent. We will be reading primarily from the Gospel of Matthew during this new Liturgical Year. It is considered the first book of the New Testament. The main theme of Matthew's Gospel is that Jesus is the King of the Jews. It emphasizes that Jesus was the fulfillment of the Old Testament. It tells how after he has been rejected by the Israel, is crucified, raised from the dead, and finally sends his disciples to preach the Good News to the whole world.

Advent begins the cycle of salvation history that is celebrated throughout the Church Year. The Prophet Isaiah announces in our first reading that beautiful image of peace that the Messiah shall bring as he says: "For from Zion shall go forth instruction...They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks."

Advent is a wonderful season of hope, hope for the present, hope for the future, and hope for each of our lives. As Human beings, we cannot live without hope. All human beings hope to live in peace, to have what they need to live and care for the families.

While so many in the world can only hope, we as Catholic Christians are reminded in this Advent Season that the Hope of the World has already come and is in the world now.

He has come in the person of Jesus Christ born of Mary. Jesus is the Son of God who lived, who died, who rose again and lives forever. We celebrate that He is here present among us in his Body and Blood, the Eucharist. He is here among us in his Church and He is here among us in each of us who were baptized into His Mystical Body.

I invite you, as I do each Advent, to make use of the wonderful gift of forgiveness that is ours through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. There is no better way to prepare to celebrate the Christmas Season than to be renewed spiritually by this Sacrament. Each year we have a Deanery Penance Service to help us prepare for Christmas.

#### Communal Penance Service

Our Deanery Communal Penance Service will be held on Monday, December 16, at 7:30 p.m. at Our Lady of the Assumption Church, Emerson. Why not take advantage of the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation during this Advent Season? Priests from all the parishes in our Deanery will join to hear confessions. It would be a wonderful example to your family if you make it a family celebration.

#### Christmas Season

The *Christmas Season* is the fulfillment of God the Father's promise not to leave us orphans because of Adam's sin. God promised that one day he would reconcile us to himself. He revealed that his plan was to send his only begotten Son, the second person of the Holy Trinity, into the world to be one of us and that He would give himself up for our ransom from sin. Christmas is the joyful celebration of the fulfillment of that promise. In the Christmas Season, we celebrate Jesus' birth and experience him as one of us. Truly we celebrate: "Emmanuel, God is with us."

#### Keep Christ in Christmas

Each year I make the same request of you for your Christmas Decorations. One of the most important ways we can teach about the meaning of Christmas is by how we prepare for the celebration of Christmas. Just as we prepare our hearts and souls for Christmas by reception of the Sacraments, so too we should prepare our homes for this celebration. Our homes, inside and outside, must reflect that the heart of the Christmas Season is the Nativity. When we decorate our homes with lights and trees and all kinds of figurines, let us not forget that at the center must be a Crèche with the infant Jesus. Without that all other decorations are meaningless to a Catholic Christian.

When someone sees your home from the outside, will they see the Nativity at the center of your decorations? When someone enters your home during the Christmas Season, will the Crèche be the highlight of your decorations? If the Crèche is not highly visible, what message are you sending?

My brother Knights, as husbands, fathers, grandfathers, uncles, nephews, and brothers, let us pledge to be examples of faith that teaches all those we meet about the meaning of Christmas. In Christmas, we are celebrating our union with God through the Incarnation of Jesus, which took place in Bethlehem 2000 years ago, we are celebrating the *Birth of Jesus*.
