Feast of the Church in June

This June is filled with many special celebrations of the Church. On the 9th we celebrate the great "*Feast of the Holy Spirit, Pentecost.*" This is the day we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles. It marks the Birth of the Church. This marvelous Feast recalls that day when the Apostles and Disciples, praying, hiding, and sitting in the upper room, were empowered by the Holy Spirit to go out and preach and teach, without fear, the message of the risen Lord, Jesus. This Feast is a reminder to all of us of the ongoing presence, power, and gifts of the Holy Spirit in the Church and in each one of us.

On the 16th we have the "*Feast of the Most Holy Trinity.*" This Feast celebrates the fundamental dogma on which everything in Christianity is based. This Dogma is that of the Blessed Trinity. It is in the name of the Holy Trinity that all Christians are baptized. The Feast of the Blessed Trinity needs to be understood and celebrated as a prolongation of the mysteries of Christ and as the solemn expression of our faith in this triune life of the Divine Persons. We have been given access to the Holy Trinity by our Baptism and by the Redemption won for us by Christ. Only in heaven shall we fully understand what it means, to be in union with Christ and to share as sons and daughters in the very life of God.

Finally, on the 23rd we celebrate the great gift of the "*Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ,*" also known as "*The Feast of Corpus Christi.*" In this Feast we celebrate the Eucharist as the gift from the Holy Trinity of the true Body and Blood of Christ. It proclaims the truth of the mystery of the Eucharist, which is transubstantiation. Transubstantiation means that the bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Christ. The "*Feast of Corpus Christi*" centers on the two manifestations of the Body of Christ. The first is the "Holy Eucharist" and the second is the "Church." The Church is the Mystical Body of Christ. The principal purpose of this Feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist, the real presence of Christ.

My Brothers, this is a wonderful month. It is a time of graduations, weddings, end of the academic school year, and the beginning of summer vacations. It is a month in which we look forward to taking time to be with our families and relaxing from the hectic pace of the academic year around which so much of our lives revolve.

I am sure all of you are caught up in the graduation and wedding celebrations that come with June. As we move toward the summer and the slowing down of activities, we look forward to weekends with family and friends. We look forward to BBQs and shore or mountain getaways.
