# \*\*\*\* Chaplain's Message\*\*\*\*

My Brother Knights, the month of March marks the beginning of the Penitential Season of Lent. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, the 6th. On Wednesday we will be marked with ashes in the Sign of the Cross on our foreheads to remind us that we are mortal and that one day our lives will end. We will be called on to make an account of our lives before God for the gift of life he has given us.

We will have to account for how we used the gifts of time, talent, and treasure that God has given us. During the Lenten Season we will hear the Lord speaking to us and giving us the opportunity to grow in holiness. He will give us the chance to repent for the sins we have committed and for the times we have failed to do good. It can be an amazing time of renewal for each of us. Like Jesus in the desert, let us use these "40 Days of Lent" to renew ourselves in His image.

Lent is the season we recall how deeply loved we are by our Lord, Jesus Christ. For it was out of love for us that he accepted his suffering and death on the Cross. As Jesus says in the Gospels, "What greater love is there than to lay down one's life for one's friends," and Jesus did that for all of us.

Our Lord came into the world not to condemn it, but to save it. His whole life was to bring forgiveness of sins and to open the gates of eternal life. Jesus gave his life for us so that we might be saved. All we need to do now is accept his gift and ask his forgiveness. There is no sin so great that he will not forgive us. There is nothing for us to fear.

During the Season of Lent we are called by the Church to cleanse ourselves of the bad habits and sins that prevent us from living fully our faith as disciples of the Lord. Just as Jesus cleansed the leper in the Gospels, Lent reminds us that he can cleanse us of our sins.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is readily available to all. All the parishes have confessions scheduled at regular times and your priests will see you at special times if you can't make the regular time.

# <u>ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK – 2019 LENTEN</u> REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one full meal is permitted and two smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty\*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 10, 2019, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 16, 2019.

\*Canon 920, 1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

There are many Catholic Veterans in the residence at the Paramus Veterans Home. 

The scholarship committee of Knights of Columbus Mother Seton Council #5427 will again award three scholarships from the James Picarella Memorial Trust Fund and one Mother Seton Scholarship. Each scholarship is for \$1,000.

Applicants for the Picarella Scholarship must be graduating high school this year and must be residents of the Township of Washington. Non-residents who have a father, brother, or grandfather as a member in good standing of Mother Seton Council #5427 for at least one year prior to the date of the application may also apply.

Applicants for the Mother Seton Scholarship may be a member of the council or be related to a council member in good standing. They may be high school seniors or enrolled in any continuing educational program, but not extending beyond a bachelor's degree.

Following are the principal criteria for selecting the winners:

- 1. The award must be applied toward tuition for a full-time student at any accredited institution of higher education: college, business, nursing, or technical school.
- 2. The award will be in one payment to the student upon proof of enrollment.
- 3. While scholastic ability is of great importance, we will also consider financial need, community involvement, and extracurricular activities.
- 4. The application must be completed by the student in its entirety. Leave no blanks. If something does not apply, please state that fact. A high school transcript must accompany the completed application. An incomplete application will be disqualified.

Applications are available at the Westwood High School and Immaculate Heart Academy Guidance Offices, the school websites, and the Knights of Columbus Council. Completed applications must be in a sealed envelope addressed to Mr. Paul Elterlein, Scholarship Chairman, Knights of Columbus, 79 Pascack Road, Twp. of Washington 07676, no later than May 15, 2021. If you have any questions, call Mr. Elterlein at 201-265-1749. The scholarships will be awarded at the Awards Night Meeting, Thursday, May 27, 2021.

The Knights of Columbus was founded in 1882 at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut, by Fr. Michael J. McGivney. It is the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization with nearly 1.9 million members worldwide. It is also one of the most active charitable organizations in the United States.
