**** Chaplain's Message****

Brother Knights, the month of November is a special time in the Church and the Community. We begin with two special days in the life of the Church. They are *All Saints Day* and *All Souls Day*. These two celebrations focus our attention on and make clear the meaning of the Mystical Body of Christ. Also in November, we have the great secular celebration of *Thanksgiving*.

The Mystical Body of Christ is made up of three groups. The first is made up of us, who are the living on earth today, and is known as the Church Militant. The second is the Church Suffering. This is made up of the souls in purgatory who have not passed through the gates of heaven because they are undergoing their final purification for their sins before entering the Kingdom. Finally, there is the Church Triumphant, this is made up of all the Saints, named and unnamed, who are in the Heavenly Kingdom.

This union is expressed most beautifully in the *Feast of All Saints* and the *Feast of All Souls Day*. In these two celebrations, the Mystical Body of Christ is united.

Feasts All Saints and All Souls

Friday, November 1, is the *Feast of All Saints Day*. On All Saints Day we call on the Church Triumphant; that is, the Saints in Heaven, to intercede for us the Church on earth.

We were blessed this year in a special way with the Canonization of five new Saints in the Church. On October 13, Pope Francis canonized these newest recognized Saints. They are England's, Cardinal John Henry Newman; Italy's Sr. Giuseppina Vannini, founder of the Daughters of Saint Camillus; India's Sr. Mariam Thresia Chiramel Mankidiyan, founder of the Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Family; Brazil's Sister Dulce Lopes Pontes; and Switzerland's, Margherita Bay, a laywoman. We call upon all the Saints and especially our newest saints to pray for the Church in these difficult days in our Church's history.

This is followed on Saturday with the Feast of All Souls Day. On this day the Church Militant; that is, we the living, may intercede for our departed brothers and sisters who have not yet completed their purification and crossed over into Heaven. Only we the living can intercede for them and help them to cross through the gates from Purgatory into Heaven. It has always been the teaching and tradition of the Church that our prayers and sacrifices offered for the souls in Purgatory can shorten their purification period.

These are two special days in the Church Year. These two celebrations are the embodiment of the meaning of the *Mystical Body of Christ*. They teach us that we the living are in union, through the *Mystical Body of Christ*, with our brothers and sisters who have gone before us.
