THE DISCIPLE'S TOOLBOX – What Every Follower of Jesus Must Carry Daily

Disciples don't just follow Jesus — they *carry* the tools He gave them. Here is 6 essential "tools" every disciple needs.

Core Scripture:

Luke 9:23 NKJV — "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me."

The 6 Tools in the Disciple's Toolbox

The Tool of SURRENDER

- Scripture: Romans 12:1
- Point: You can't follow Jesus with a full toolbox of old habits.

The Tool of SCRIPTURE

- Scripture: 2 Timothy 3:16
- Point: This is your manual, your map, your sword.

The Tool of PRAYER

- Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 5:17
- Point: Communication is how you stay connected to the Master.

4 The Tool of OBEDIENCE

- Scripture: John 14:15
- Point: Obedience isn't about rules it's about relationship.

The Tool of COMMUNITY

• Scripture: Hebrews 10:24–25

• Point: Lone-ranger Christians become easy targets. Stick together.

6 The Tool of DISCIPLINE

- Scripture: 1 Corinthians 9:27
- Point: You grow stronger by choosing spiritual discipline daily.

Remember this:

- 1. Disciples grow daily, not occasionally.
- 2. Obedience unlocks spiritual strength.
- 3. Disciples don't walk alone they walk together.

THE COST OF FOLLOWING JESUS

Following Jesus is the greatest invitation in the world — but it is not the cheapest. Salvation is free, but discipleship will cost you something. Jesus never hid this truth. He spoke it plainly, lovingly, and boldly so His followers would understand the weight and beauty of the journey ahead.

When we say "Yes, Lord, I will follow You," we are stepping into a life that is transformed, surrendered, and marked by obedience. This isn't a casual relationship — it's a covenant of love. And real love costs something.

1. The Cost of Surrendering Your Own Way

"If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself..."

— Luke 9:23 (NKJV)

To follow Jesus, we must lay down the throne of "me, myself, and I." Half-hearted surrender never leads to whole-hearted discipleship.

This means:

- letting go of old habits
- releasing our preferences
- surrendering our timing
- saying "Your will, not mine, Lord"

Following Jesus will cost your old life, but the new one He gives is priceless.

2. The Cost of Carrying Your Cross Daily

"...take up his cross daily..."

— Luke 9:23 (NKJV)

The cross represents death to self and complete devotion to Jesus. This isn't a one-time event — this is a daily decision.

Carrying your cross means:

choosing forgiveness when the flesh wants revenge

- choosing purity when temptation whispers
- · choosing truth when lies seem easier
- choosing love when hurt feels heavy

Every disciple carries something — and Jesus promises to give you strength for the journey.

3. The Cost of Letting Go of the World

"For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul?"

— Matthew 16:26 (NKJV)

You cannot cling to the world and cling to Jesus at the same time.

Disciples give up:

- · worldly approval
- worldly lifestyles
- worldly comfort
- · worldly applause

But they gain something far better — the approval of Heaven.

4. The Cost of Obeying Even When It's Hard

"If you love Me, keep My commandments."

— John 14:15 (NKJV)

Obedience is the currency of discipleship. Jesus doesn't ask for perfect performance — He asks for a willing heart.

Obedience may cost you:

- relationships
- opportunities
- routines
- comfort zones

But it rewards you with:

- spiritual authority
- peace
- protection
- deeper intimacy with Jesus

5. The Cost of Being Different

Following Jesus sets you apart. You will look different, sound different, and live different from the world. Yes, some may not understand. Some may walk away. Some may criticize.

But that's okay, because you're being shaped into His image.

And the more you look like Jesus, the less you will fit into places He never called you to stay.

6. The Cost Leads to the Greatest Gain

Every cost is connected to a promise.

Jesus said:

"And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for My name's sake, shall receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life."

— Matthew 19:29 (NKJV)

Know this: Whatever you surrender, He restores with grace, strength, joy, and eternal reward.

The cost is real — but the **gain is eternal**.

Following Jesus may cost you comfort, pride, reputation, and old ways of living. But it will give you purpose, peace, identity, healing, and everlasting life.

Say "YES" again tonight.

Pick up your cross again tonight.

Follow Him again tonight.

Because Jesus is worth it — all of it.
