Phishing scams – What to look out for!

- Spelling and grammar mistakes! Read the message carefully. A real professional company would not make these mistakes in their messages.
- Generic or missing greeting! A real company will always address you by your name not by 'Dear customer'!
- A sense of urgency! The sender might tell you that you have a limited amount of time to respond so you must be quick!
- Account alert! The email makes you think that there is something wrong with your account and you must act immediately to sort it out!
- A shortened URL! A website address might appear on the email which looks it has been condensed. These often lead to suspicious or risky websites!
- "Help Friend!" A message might come asking for help.
 It may even include a photo of someone you know but
 the message has not been sent by them!
- Too good to be true! If it sounds too good to be true
 or too easy then it is probably not real!
