ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

CHELAN SPRINGS PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That I, JOHN F. HOBBS, acting as the incorporator of a corporation under the provisions of the Washington Non-Profit Corporation Act, Revised Code of Washington (24.03) adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of this corporation shall be the CHELAN SPRINGS PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION.

ARTICLE II

DURATION

The period of duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III

PURPOSES

The purposes for which this corporation is formed are:

1. To purchase or otherwise acquire, construct, improve, develop, repair, maintain, operate, care for and/or dispose of roads, streets, alleys, culverts, drains, and any and all other kinds and types of facilities appurtenant thereto, and any and all kinds of real and/or

personal property, including interests of any degree therein, which may be necessary or convenient for the accomplishment of this general purpose; all for the benefit only of the following described property:

Chelan Springs Division 1, Division 2, and Division 3, an unrecorded plat located in Sections 11, 12, 13, 14, 22, 23, 24, 27 Township 27 North, Range 23, East of the Willamette Meridian, and Government Lots 3 and 4, and Sections 7, and Government Lot 1, Section 18, Township 27 North, Range 24 E., W.M., Douglas County, Washington.

- 2. To fix, establish, levy and collect annually such charges and/or assessments as may be necessary in the judgment of the Board of Directors to carry out any or all of the purposes for which this corporation is formed, but not in excess of the maximum from time to time fixed by the Bylaws.
- 3. To expend the monies collected by the corporation from dues and/or assessments for the payment and discharge of costs, expenses and obligations incurred by the corporation in carrying out any and all of the purposes for which the corporation is formed.
 - 4. To install and maintain springs and sources of water.
- 5. Nothing contained in these Articles of Incorporation shall be construed as authorizing or permitting the corporation to own, manage or operate any real or personal property for profit. It is the intention and purpose of the corporation that the business of the corporation shall not be carried on for profit either to itself or for the benefit of its members, and wherever it is authorized to collect charges, dues or assessments it shall have no power or authority to use such funds except for payment of the actual cost or expense of the act, duty, power or transaction performed as authorized hereby.

6. The corporation shall have the power to do and perform any and all acts which may be either necessary or proper or convenient for or incidental to the exercise of any of the foregoing powers and such other powers as are granted to the corporation by RCW 24.03.035 and any other laws of the State of Washington relating to corporations formed under RCW Chapter 24.03.

ARTICLE IV

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

- 1. The manner and procedure for the management of the internal affairs of the corporation, including the establishment of dues and the limitations thereupon, shall be as set forth in the Bylaws to be adopted by the Board of Directors.
- 2. In the event of dissolution of the corporation the assets remaining after payment of all corporate obligations shall be distributed to the Park Board of Douglas County, Washington or, if there be none, to any non-profit corporation whose purpose is to promote or maintain quality recreational facilities in Douglas County, Washington.

ARTICLE V

MEMBERSHIP

There shall be no capital stock in this corporation. Membership shall consist of all persons who shall own one or more parcels or lots within the areas identified in Article A, Paragraph B, of these Articles of Incorporation, and who shall agree to become members, and membership and certificates evidencing the same shall be inseparably appurtenant to

tracts, lots or parcels owned by the members, and upon transfer of ownership or contract for the sale of any such land shall be deemed thereupon to be transferred to the grantee or contract purchaser. No membership or certificate of membership shall be transferred, assigned or conveyed to any other member. In the event of the death of a member, the membership and certificate of membership of the deceased shall become the property of the personal representative of the deceased member upon appointment and qualification as such in a judicial proceeding, and such personal representative shall have all of the rights, privileges and liabilities of that membership until title to the land appurtenant thereto shall be transferred or contracted to be transferred. Each member shall have one vote for each separate lot, parcel or tract owned by him.

ARTICLE VI

REGISTERED OFFICE

The address of the initial registered office of this corporation shall be 7433 S.E. 27th, Mercer Island, Washington. The name of the initial registered agent of the corporation at such address is John F. Hobbs.

ARTICLE VII

DIRECTORS

The number of Directors constituting the original Board shall be three. The names and addresses of the persons who shall serve as the initial Directors of this corporation are as follows:


