Leona Spencer McConnell

The name of Spencer can be traced in history to a very early date, and notwithstanding the name has undergone some changes the connection is distinct. In England the name was introduced during the Norman Invasion under the leadership of William the Conquer, in 1066, and at that time it bore the form of Le Dispenser and sharing in the spoils of conquest the connection represented large estates and a proportionate influence in the affairs of government.

From 1262 to 1265 during the last years of the reign of Henry 3rd Hugh Le Dispenser was Justiceary of England, an office abolished in the next reign, that of Edward I, on account of the power vested in it and its supposed danger to the crown. During the reign of Edward II an heir of the Le Dispenser family became a favorite of the King and was married to the Kings niece, an heiress of the House of Gloucester. The influence exerted by him upon the King was so marked that it excited the jealousy of the Nobility, and through their influence he was banished from the Kingdom in 1321.

From the fourteenth to the sixteenth centuries the literature of England underwent a gradual change and the dropping of the French Titles left the name Spenser and Spencer. The different spelling of the name, which came from the same source may thus be accounted for.

The Spencers of Althorp, the ancestors of the Spencers and Churchills of the seventeenth century became prominent during the sixteenth century and influenced the affairs of government for several generations. Of this connection was Edmund Spencer, the poet, who flourished in the latter half of the sixteenth century, dying in 1553. His poems were unsurpassed in the literature of the age, and are the admiration of the classic scholars of today. There were others of this line who were distinguished, several receiving titles of nobility which made them prominent in affairs of State. Among them were Earl of Sunderland, John George, second Earl Spencer, born in 1758 and died in 1834, Charles, third, Earl Spencer, Viscount Althorp, etc.

The renown of the Spencers must have departed after their advent to this country. In the United States they are numerous but scattered broadcast as it were, being found in many States of the Union and also in Canada, though few have come to the front in the line of politics. John C. Spencer was Secretary of War under President Tyler, and George Spencer was Member of Congress from Georgia, later P. R. Spencer, the founder of the Spencerian School of Penmanship was of this connection and it is said of him that he commenced his system by writing with his fingers in the sands of Lake Erie's Shore. So far as we are able to ascertain the mass of the various branches are prominent in the mercantile, mechanical, and agricultural interests of the republic.

About 1750 perhaps a little earlier the family of Spencers, of which the subjects of this sketch are members, emigrated from England to America, and of said family was Samuel Bond Spencer. The best account we can give of him is that he had one daughter and two sons. The sons names were John and Joseph. The sons arrived at manhood about the breaking out of the revolutionary war, but that they were called upon to do military service we have no account; that they never entered the army the Author is inclined to believe. We have heard them tell of the marching of soldiers carrying off their grain but nothing about taking part in the conflict. Perhaps the mechanical genius of the family was employed in the service of their country, thus explaining the matter, but of that we cannot say.

At this time the brothers mentioned were not members of any religious organization. Subsequently John married Susanna Lightfoot of Berks County, Penna. who was a Friend, and removed to Center County, and of this union came the Half Moon Spencers so-called. Joseph married Nancy Thompkins of Chester County about the year 1780, and about the closing of the war moved to Northumberland County and settled on Chilisguague Creek. (Chillysquaky, frozen duck). There his family grew up, or nearly so. Their children were six in number, three sons and three daughters. The sons names were Samuel, Joseph and Jesse, the daughters names, Hannah, Nancy and Patty, so called. The

latter died when a young woman.

In 1808 Joseph Spencer Sr. moved to Clearfield County with his family which was then unbroken, and purchased from Benjamin Fenton 440 acres of land. The land was in its primitive state excepting about two acres which was cleared and had a small log house upon it. The tract was situated between the present sight of the village of Pennville, and the Susquehanna River, about one mile south of Pennville. Four hundred acres were divided into four farms of one hundred acres each, the father retaining one of the farms and setting apart a farm of corresponding size for each of his three sons. The forty acres were held in common. As this lot bordered upon the Susquehanna River, they subsequently built a saw mill which was driven by the waters of the stream.

It seemed they were not long to remain in peaceful possession of what they intended to make their future homes. Another party made a demand of the land, claiming they had an older title, and persistently forcing their claims to a prolonged litigation. The case had two trials in the county court, and was finally decided in the Supreme Court, the defendants gaining the suit each time.

No court being organized in Clearfield County at that time, they were compelled to attend court at Bellefonte, which made it expensive, without taking into consideration the annoyance and anxiety. They paid to their three Attorneys alone, one hundred dollars each.

The farms now rank among the best in the county and with exception of the Samuel Spencer farm which is owned by James Arthurs, remain in the hands of the direct connections of the family. The father and sons remained on their respective farms during life. Samuel, the eldest son married a first cousin, Sarah Spencer, and had seven children, who grew to manhood and womanhood, all of whom married and reared families except two daughters. The sons are Joseph, John, Jonathan and David; the daughters, Hannah, Sarah and Sussannah. Joseph is in the State of Ohio, engaged in the milling business with his sons. John moved to Ohio in 1865 or 1866 and engaged in the milling business for a time, a few years afterward removing to Kansas and engaging in farming in connection with his sons. Jonathan was a miller by trade and is deceased. David now resides at Lumber City and has turned his attention to medicine, after some years of farming. Hannah married J. Harlan Fisher, moved to Ohio and both she and her husband are dead. Sarah and Susannah are unmarried and living at Lumber City.

Joseph married Lydia Moore, Their family consisted of six sons and four daughters, namely: Charles, James, Samuel, Joseph M., Miles Sharpless, Harrison W., Nancy, Martha, Lavina and Eliza, all of whom reached maturity and married except Charles whose death resulted from an accident when about the age of twenty two years.

At this writing only four remain to re-

present this latter family viz: Joseph M., Miles S., Harrison W. and Martha. James married Mary Kirk; Samuel married Lydia E. Bell; Joseph married Lydia A. Griest; Miles S. married Lucinda M. Griest; Harrison W. married Amanda Garreston; Nancy married William S. Porter; Martha married L. D. England; Lavina married Amos Hile; and Eliza married C. W. Moore; Martha and husband moved to Ohio 23 years ago. They reared ten children who are all married but one son who is with his mother. The rest are settled in one neighborhood in Medina County and have sufficient life's comforts. Theodore died several years ago.

Jesse married Anna Moore. Their children reaching maturity were three sons and two daughters. The sons were: Abram, Andrew and David, the daughters, Mary, Jane and Susannah. Abram is well known as a practical farmer. Andrew and David were also farmers. Andrew now deceased. Susannah married Moses Owens, two of whose sons Matthew and Albert are residents of Curwensville and both in the harness business. Hannah and Nancy of the original family lived unmarried to a good age.

To record all the deaths in the connection would be to manifest, that much of the mental had yielded to that which is immortal, and may we not hope that what seemed to be our loss is their gain.
