## Don't know where to begin your genealogy journey?

Here are three easy steps that will help you get started:

## 1. Start with what you know.

Start with yourself, your parents, and your grandparents and write them on:

Pedigree Chart, a visual representation of "bloodline" of an individual. This is true genetic ancestry for the individual.

**Family Group Sheet**, each group sheet will show represents one family unit. Father, Mother, and all Children are listed.

## 2. Look for Vital Records 🔭

Birth, Marriage, and Death Records

- shows date of event, full names, addresses, and places
- spouse's name, mother's maiden name, parents name
- occupation and cause of death

## 3. Explore Census Records

Go to www. archives.gov/research/census to see what years are available and which sites you can view them from.
