This is to certify that John C. Guiher enlisted Sept. 1, 1861 from Clarion County, Pa and was mustered into the United States Service at Kitanning, Pa to serve three years as a private in Company A, 103<sup>rd</sup> Regiment, Pa Volunteer Infantry under Captain R Lauchran, and Colonel T. J. Lehzman. The Regiment was assigned to Keyes corps arriving at the Potomac and Comrade Guiher shared the fortunes of his regiment in all its movements as follows: Siege of Yorktown April 5-May 2, 1862, Williamsburg May 5, 62, Fair Oaks May 8, 1862, Severe days battles June 26- July 1, 1862, Malvern Hill June 30, 1862, The Regiment was then transferred to Butlers Corps and engaged at Kinston Dec. 14, 1862, Little Washington Dec. 14, 1862, Plymouth, N.C. where Comrade Guiher and the whole regiment was captured. Comrade Guiher was taken to Andersonville April 18, 1864 held five months then taken to Charleston, S.C. and held one month, then to Florence held four months after which he was paroled and taken to Annapolis from where he was Honorably Discharged by G.O. no. 77 and close of the war. Reenlisted as a veteran Jan. 1, 64 member of Wilson Caldwell Pa X . Sept of Pa.
