UNITING PEOPLE TO PROTECT THE PLANET Earth Hour 2013: Saturday 23rd March, 8:30PM

In 2007, WWF-Australia inspired Sydney-siders to show their support for climate change action in the first ever Earth Hour event. It showed that everyone, from children to CEOs and politicians, has the power to change the world they live in. In Sydney, Australia, 2.2 million individuals and more than 2,000 businesses turned their lights out for one hour to take a stand against climate change.

In 2008, the plan was to take Earth Hour to the rest of Australia. But then the City of Toronto, Canada, signed up and it wasn't long before 35 countries and almost 400 cities and towns were part of the event. It said something compelling to the world: that the climate challenges facing our planet are so significant that change needs to be global.

With the invitation to "switch off" extended to everyone, Earth Hour quickly became an annual global event. It's scheduled on the last Saturday of every March – closely coinciding with the equinox to ensure most cities are in darkness as it rolled out around the Earth.

In 2011, Earth Hour saw hundreds of millions of people across 135 countries switch off for an hour. But it also marked the start of something new – going Beyond the Hour to commit to lasting action on climate change. In 2012, Earth Hour celebrated its largest event to date with more than 6,950 cities and towns in 152 countries and territories switching off their lights, and with hundreds of thousands of people accepting an IWIYW challenge to take their commitment to the planet beyond the hour. With the power of social networks used to promote the campaign, Earth Hour is working towards an interconnected global community committed to creating a more sustainable planet.

TENANT SURVEY REVEALS BOMA 360 BUILDINGS OUTSHINE COMPETITION

BOMA 360 Buildings Score Higher in 52 Out of 54 Tenant Satisfaction Categories

According to a new study by Kingsley Associates buildings that have earned the BOMA 360 Performance Program® designation have higher tenant satisfaction scores in 52 out of 54 categories compared to commercial office buildings without the BOMA 360 designation. Most notably, 92 percent of tenants in BOMA 360 buildings report high overall satisfaction.

Now in its fourth year, BOMA 360 is a commercial real estate designation developed by the Building Owners and Managers Association (BOMA) International that recognizes all-around excellence in building operations and management. The program benchmarks a building's performance in six key areas including: operations and management; security and safety; training and education; energy; environment and sustainability; and tenant relations. Currently there are 462 BOMA 360 buildings in more than 55 cities in the U.S., including Atlanta, Boston, Dallas, Houston, San Francisco and Washington, D.C., which each have more than 25 BOMA 360 buildings.

"BOMA 360 is an increasingly valuable designation for property owners and managers to differentiate their assets as a way to recruit and retain tenants," said BOMA International Chairelect Joseph W. Markling, managing director, Strategic Accounts at CBRE. "The findings of this study confirm that BOMA 360 buildings consistently provide quality tenant service and achieve top-notch performance."

In addition to overall property management, Kingsley Associates surveyed tenants in categories including maintenance, leasing, security and air quality. BOMA 360 buildings outperformed a comparable set of commercial office buildings without the designation in all of the top survey categories. Other key highlights:

- 74 percent of tenants in BOMA 360 buildings noted they are satisfied with the value they receive for the rent they pay, compared to 68 percent of tenants in other buildings.
- More than 90 percent of tenants rated personnel in BOMA 360 buildings as "good" or "excellent."
- 88 percent of tenants in BOMA 360 buildings reported they are happy with the overall sense of security compared to 84 percent of tenants in other buildings.
- 80 percent of tenants in BOMA 360 buildings rated the indoor air quality "good" or "excellent" compared to 74 percent of tenants in other buildings.

Kingsley Associates is the real estate industry's leading provider of research and consulting services. These findings are based on surveys of 4,000 tenants in 180 BOMA 360 buildings.

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
