Your child took the

Naglieri General Ability Tests to gather information that will help guide his or her curriculum and instruction. These ability tests measure thinking with verbal, nonverbal, and quantitative test content. The questions on the three tests measure your child's general ability by measuring understanding of relationships among pictures (the verbal test), diagrams (the nonverbal test), and numbers (the quantitative test). The questions on these tests can be solved regardless of the language the student speaks or the knowledge gained by educational instruction.

The test scores provided below are percentile scores. It is important to note that a percentile is not the same as the percent of questions answered correctly. Percentile scores provide a comparison of your child's performance to their local community. Percentile scores are used to rank students on a scale of 1 to 99. If a student has a percentile of 71, it indicates this student scored higher than 70 of every 100 students that took the same test at the same time.

The scores reflect the student's performance on each of the tests. For example, a score of 90 indicates that the student earned a score that was equal to or greater than 90% of students in the sample. If your child scores at the 90th percentile or higher, specialized services are necessary.
