

Day 1, Thursday, October 26

Arrival to Havana, Cuba (pending flight info).

Meet your CET and CariBeat representatives at the exit of the airport terminal and transfer to accommodations.

Check-into your accommodations. We've selected a series of privately owned, boutique hotel properties that boast old world charm and topnotch service.

Sunset Jazz at Malecon 663. Set in a roof top with a unique view of the city and the famous Malecón, this rooftop offers a creative menu with a combination of Cuban recipes and cocktails with current trend fusion.

Welcome dinner at La Guarida. #418 Concordia's story begins in 1913 as the Camagüey mansion, a space known for its opulent parties and visitors. In 1994, it appeared in the ground-breaking and Oscar-nominated Cuban film *Fresa y chocolate* as the home of this movie's gay hero. In 1996, Enrique Nunez opened La Guarida, one of the early private eateries in Cuba's long state-controlled dining scene. Today, the winding staircase ushers you into this time-worn mansion that showcases Cuba's love affair between antiquity and modernity.

Day 2, Friday, October 27

Roundtable discussion with Cuban entrepreneurs at Estudio 50 art space. Get an overview of the private sector in Cuba and some of the challenges and opportunities start-ups face. The conversation will provide an interesting look into the Cuban economy and also give you a starting point for thinking about ways that your visit can help support Cuban entrepreneurs.

Percussion and dance time with Habana Compas Dance. Liliet Rivera, protege of the renowned List Alfonso Dance Company, established Habana Compas Dance in 2004 to reclaim and preserve Cuba's dance heritage from Spain and Africa.

Midday **Light lunch at Estudio 50.** Enjoy sandwiches, empanadas, fruits and other delicious treats by one of Havana's paladares.

Afternoon *Choose your activity:*

- Boxing with champions. Visit Rafael Trejo gym to meet with Cuban boxers and learn about their passion, struggles and inspirations. Opportunity to practice your fighting skills with Cuba's best.
- **Printmaking class with Cuban artist Moya.** Make your own art and bring it home!
- **Tour of La Finca Vigía**, formerly the home of Ernest Hemingway, it still houses his expansive collection of books and his boat El Pilar.
- Attend salsa lessons with a private instructor. Learn the moves of Cuba's most famous type of dance.

Get down with Cuban Music. Rooftop Jam Session in the Cerro neighborhood with percussionist Delgnis.

Dinner at Paladar Yarini, situated in the middle of Havana's new Art District, San Isidro. This bar restaurant is located on top of the **Galeria Taller Gorría**, an art gallery and sociocultural project which has become a confluence space for the best of the national and international artistic avant-garde.

Day 3, Saturday, October 28

Morning Choose your activity:

- Boxing with champions.
- Printmaking class.
- Tour of La Finca Vigía.
- Salsa-dancing.

Lunch at your boutique hotel.

Behind-the-Scenes Art Tour. Visit the homes and studios of independent Cuban Artists.

Private performance by the female hip hop/jazz duo La Reyna y Real, the latest flame in Cuban underground music scene. The group's music focuses on breaking down stereotypes in Cuban society, including machismo, healthy relationships, gender relations and race. They will share info about their interesting musical journey and insight into the challenges and opportunities young Cubans face.

Enjoy dinner, art, music and dancing at Fabrica de Arte Cubano. The brainchild of Afro-Cuban musician X-Alfonso, this is one of Havana's finest cultural projects, an intellectual and artistic nexus that draws Cuban and international visitors. Explore the multi-media gallery spaces and catch a live performance. (meal not included – to be paid in cash on the ground)

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Day 4, Sunday, October 29

Walking tour of Old Havana. Explore the historic center and learn about the history and architectural importance of Old Havana, a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1982.


Visit Callejón de Hamel, a neighborhood that has been converted into a cultural center rich in Afro-Cuba religion, art and dance.

Afternoon Caribeat Lunch Party at Marea, a private restaurant in the outskirts of Havana with a stunning location by the sea, great food and atmosphere. Bring your swimsuit and a towel if you want to take a swim!

Cigar tasting with a local expert at Café Madrigal. He will explain the qualities and traits of fine Cuban cigars and how to properly light and smoke what is considered the finest tobacco in the world. Café Madrigal, owned and run by film director Rafael Rosales, is housed in a beautiful colonial mansion with the walls lined with captivating artwork.

Cocktails and Caribbean Fashion at La Lavanderia. This multipurpose art space located in the Buena Vista neighborhood serves as workshop, studio, and gallery.

Farewell dinner at Paladar Atelier. This restaurant is equally known for its atmosphere and exquisite cuisine. The lighting and textures of the house, which was home to a pre-revolutionary senator, coupled with walls adorned in modern art, create a cozy, but modern setting.
