

SPIRITUAL READING
A Year with Mary
Daily Meditations on the Mother of God

Mary loves us because her Son died for us

Day 46

Mary's beloved Son loved us so much that he gave his life for us. What greater reason, St. Alphonsus asks, could she have for loving us as well?

Yet another motive for the love of Mary towards us is this: In us, she beholds what has been purchased at the price of the death of Jesus Christ. If a mother knew that a servant had been ransomed by a beloved son at the price of twenty years of imprisonment and suffering, how greatly would she esteem that servant – even if on this account alone! Mary well knows that her Son came into the world only to save us poor creatures, as he himself proclaimed: “The son of Man came to seek and to save the lost” (Lk 19:10). And to save us he was pleased even to lay down his life for us, and “became obedient to death” (Phil 2:8). If then, Mary loved us only a little, she would show that she valued only little the blood of her Son, which was the price of our salvation.

Because all people have been redeemed by Jesus, therefore Mary loves and protects them all. It was she who was seen by St. John in the Apocalypse, clothed with the sun: “and a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun” (Rv 12:1). She is said to be clothed with the sun because, as there is no one on earth who can be hidden from the heat of the sun – “there is nothing hidden from its heat” (Ps 19:6) – so there is no one living who can be deprived of the love of Mary.

“Who,” exclaims St. Antoninus, “can ever form an idea of the tender care that this most loving mother takes of all of us... offering and dispensing her mercy to everyone?” For our good mother desired the salvation of all, and she cooperated in obtaining it.

The Universal Church is celebrating the Jubilee Year 2025 – 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord. The Jubilee Year offers the faithful opportunities to participate in various jubilee events at the Vatican and in local dioceses. The great tradition of opening the Holy Door began when Pope Francis opened the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on December 24, 2024. Bishop Powers opened the Jubilee year on December 29, 2024 at Cathedral of Christ the King in Superior.

As a special focus in the Diocese of Superior, Cathedral of Christ the King in Superior and St. Joseph in La Pointe on Madeline Island are designated as holy sites to receive indulgences. Another special focus for the Jubilee Year is on celebrating the Consecrated Life that served our parishes in the past and the faithful sons and daughters of our diocese who committed themselves to Consecrated Life.
