SPIRITUAL READING A Year with Mary Daily Meditations on the Mother of God

Mary was an instrument of redemption

St. John of Damascus speaks to God the Son, declaring all that he accomplished by taking on flesh to redeem us. Then comes an important question: Who was the human instrument God chose to make that redemption possible?

The Father predestined her; the prophets foretold her through the Holy Spirit. His sanctifying power overshadowed her, cleansed her, and made her holy. Then you, Word of the Father, leaving your place in heaven, invited the lowliness of our nature to be united to the immeasurable greatness of your unsearchable nature as God.

You took your flesh from the flesh of the Blessed Virgin. It was given life by a reasoning soul and dwelled in her undefiled and immaculate womb. Creating yourself, and causing her to exist in you, you became perfect Man without ceasing to be perfect God, equal to your Father but taking upon yourself our weakness through unspeakable goodness.

Having become in this way the mediator between God and man, you destroyed our enmity with you. You led back to your Father those who had deserted him, the wanderers back to their home, and those in darkness back to the light. You brought pardon to the contrite and changed mortality into immortality.

You delivered the world from the error of belief in many gods, and you made men the children of God, partakers of your divine glory. You raised the human race, which was condemned to hell, above all power and majesty. And in your Person, it is now seated on the King's eternal throne in heaven.

Who was the instrument of these infinite benefits, beyond all thought and comprehension, if not the mother, every-virgin, who gave you birth?

2025 Jubilee Year of Hope Pilgrimage Sites

A Catholic pilgrimage is a sacred journey to a holy place, undertaken with the purpose of encountering God in a personal and transformative way. It does not have to be thousands of miles away. It can be as simple as visiting a nearby shrine or a historic church. What matters is the disposition of the heart—a willingness to seek God and allow Him to transform the journey.

As part of the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope, Bishop Powers has designated two parishes as pilgrimage sites in the Diocese of Superior: Cathedral of Christ the King in Superior, and St. Joseph Catholic Church in La Pointe.

St. Joseph Catholic Church will be open starting from Saturday, May 24th through Labor Day Weekend :


Memorial Day Service at Calvary Cemetery, Washburn

Why did Pope Leo XIV choose his name?

Pope Leo XIV assumed the name Leo in part to honor Pope Leo XIII (2 March 1810 – 20 July 1903) who was head of the Catholic Church from 1878 until his death. Pope Leo XIII is well known for his encyclical "Rerum Novarum" (which translates to "of revolutionary change") on worker's rights -- considered the foundational document for the church's social teaching. The document emphasized the dignity of workers and condemned the dangers of unchecked capitalism and socialism. It reaffirms the Catholic Church's purpose of working toward justice and dignity for everyone. This formed a basis for the modern understanding of Catholic social teaching, that the church bears a responsibility to manifest the gospel message that Jesus provided. He also re-established the Vatican Observatory to demonstrate the church's openness to science.
