A Year with Mary
Daily Meditations on the Mother of God

Mary will never abandon anyone

Would a mother refuse to apply medicine to her child's infected wounds, simply because they are repulsive? Of course, not, insists St. Alphonsus. In the same way, however revolting our sins may be, Mary will come to apply a remedy.

The multitude of our sins shouldn't lessen our confidence that Mary will grant our petitions when we cast ourselves at her feet. She's the mother of mercy, and mercy wouldn't be needed if there were no one who requires it. On this subject Richard of Saint Lawrence remarks, "As a good mother doesn't hesitate to apply a remedy to her child infected with ulcers, however nauseous and revolting they may be, so also is our good mother unable to abandon us when we turn to her, so that she may heal the wounds caused by our sins, however loathsome they may have made us."

This is exactly what Mary helped St. Gertrude to understand, when she showed herself to her with her mantle spread out to receive all who turn to her. At the same time the saint was told that "angels constantly guard the devotees of this Blessed Virgin from the assaults of hell."

If anyone doubts whether Mary will aid him if he turns to her, Pope Innocent III correct him with these words: "Who is there that ever, when in the night of sin, turned to this sweet lady without being relieved?" The blessed Eutychian, patriarch of Constantinople, exclaims to Mary, "Who ever faithfully begged your all-powerful aid and was abandoned by you?" Indeed, no one; for she can relieve the most wretched, and save the most abandoned. Such a case certainly never did and never will occur.

Let everyone say, then, with full confidence, in the words of that beautiful prayer addressed to the Mother of Mercy, and commonly attributed to St. Bernard: "Remember, O most pious Virgin Mary, that never was it heard of in any age that anyone having recourse to your protection was abandoned."

2025 Jubilee Year of Hope Pilgrimage Sites

A Catholic pilgrimage is a sacred journey to a holy place, undertaken with the purpose of encountering God in a personal and transformative way. It does not have to be thousands of miles away. It can be as simple as visiting a nearby shrine or a historic church. What matters is the disposition of the heart—a willingness to seek God and allow Him to transform the journey.

As part of the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope, Bishop Powers has designated two parishes as pilgrimage sites in the Diocese of Superior: *Cathedral of Christ the King in Superior*, and *St. Joseph Catholic Church in La Pointe*.

St. Joseph Catholic Church will be open starting from Saturday, May 24th through Labor Day Weekend :

Fridays for Eucharistic Adoration at 3:00 pm


Saturdays for Eucharistic celebration at 6:15 pm (Church opens at 4:00pm)

Sundays for a time of personal prayer at 9:00 am

What Is the Feast of Corpus Christi?

The Feast of Corpus Christi, also known as the *Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ*, is a Catholic celebration of the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist—and thus a sacred reminder that, in every Mass, Jesus' one sacrifice of Calvary is sacramentally made present and offered anew for "the forgiveness of the sins we daily commit".

The Church celebrates Corpus Christi to profess and adore our Eucharistic Lord. A Eucharistic procession is a public act of worship in which the Blessed Sacrament is carried in a monstrance, and incensed, through the streets of a local parish or city. The faithful follow, singing hymns and praying other prayers. This tradition symbolizes the Church's mission to carry Christ to the world (Matt. 28:18-20). It also publicly professes the Catholic belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist—safeguarding the teaching of Jesus himself (John 6:53-58; Matt. 26:26-28).
