Submission Guideline:

You are cordially invited to submit an abstract for the 2021 graduate poster and oral competitions. Students who are planning to present/compete in IFT22 or closely allied organizations are strongly encouraged to apply. Please submit the title of your research, 250-word abstract, and name of your advisor by **Friday**, **December 3**, 2020, 11:59 pm (central time). Please also let us know if you would like to be considered for competition in poster or oral division, or both. This year students from AGSC 5540 Food Policies and Regulation class and course alumni will additionally present their policy presentations in the third category. Please note that no late submission will be accepted, and only selected abstracts (finalists) will be scheduled for competition due to limitations in space and time for presentations.

You will be notified of the status of your abstract on **Monday, December 6, 2021**. Up to 6 accepted abstracts in oral and poster divisions will be entered for the Zoom competition evaluated by the judges. A new category exists this year for AGSC 5540 Food Policies and Regulation students. The top three individuals* in each category will be awarded \$300, \$200, \$100**.

The competition is free of cost for attendees. Applicants in any institutions in Tennessee are cordially invited to apply. Please note that per the policy of the funding agency for this competition meals will not be provided. Recent graduates (those who graduate late in 2020 and 2021) could also apply to compete as long as the abstract is from work completed as a student.

*Awards will be mailed to the awardees approximately up to three months after the event, after completion of W-9 forms and other paperwork. There is a myriad of regulations for issuing the awards using extramural grants and appreciate in advance the awardee's patience. The awards are supported by Public Health Microbiology Laboratory Food Processing Support Center and Public Health Microbiology Laboratory extramural grants (USDA NIFA projects 2017-07534; 2017-04975; 2017-06088).
