Students who are planning to present/compete in IFT21 or closely allied organizations are strongly encouraged to apply. Please submit title of your research, 250-word abstract, and name of your advisor by **Friday August 28 2020, 11:59 pm** (central time). Please also let us know if you would like to be considered for competition in poster or oral division, or both. Please note that no late submission will be accepted and only selected abstracts will be scheduled for competition due to limitation in space and time for presentations. Those who applied for the previous deadline do not need to re-apply and their abstract will be kept file for new deadline.

You will be notified about status of your abstract on **Monday August 31**, **2020**. Up to 6 accepted abstracts in oral and poster divisions will be entered for onsite competition evaluated by three judges. A new category exist this year for oral competitions for up to 6 current post-doctoral researchers and recent graduates for career-development (those graduated in Fall 2019 with a graduate degree). Top three individuals* in each category will be awarded \$400, \$300, \$200**.
