

# **ABOUT THE COVER**

Carl's Drug Store has been a Greencastle fixture and source of medical care since April 1825.

The drug store's founder, Adam Carl was born on December 16, 1800, in Hanover, PA. Adam passed away in Greencastle in April 1891 at the age of 90 years and four months.

Adam Carl came to Greencastle in 1825. Here, he opened a drug store ~ Carl's Drug Store. Four years later in March 1829, Adam studied medicine under the tutelage of Dr. J. Henry Miller and received his medical degree from Washington Medical College, Baltimore, MD. For the next 62 years, riding only on horseback, Adam Carl continuously practiced medicine in the Greencastle-Antrim area.

Dr. Carl had seven children. William, their first born, operated the drug store until he passed away at age 47. The youngest, Mary Ellen, married Dr. Franklin A. Bushey, a physician and surgeon. After the Civil War, Dr. Bushey worked with Dr. Adam Carl treating patients and dispensing medications.

In 1880, grandson Charles B. Carl graduated from Philadelphia College of Pharmacy with a pharmaceutical degree. Nine years later in 1889, he purchased the drug store. Edward Carl, son of Charles, was the last Carl family member to own the drug store ending the family tenure of 149 years, from 1825 to 1974.

In 1974, Pharmacist Frank Ervin became the first non-Carl family member to own Carl's Drug Store. Frank was no stranger to Carl's, as he "grew up" in the drug store during the time his father Richard Ervin was the assistant pharmacist. When Frank received his degree, he was also hired by Edward Carl.

On March 8, 1999, Frank Ervin made the decision to move Carl's Drug Store, from East Baltimore Street, in downtown Greencastle, to 145 North Antrim Way – a much larger building with a sizeable parking lot. Ervin sold Carl's Drug Store to Roger Savage in 2013. Ten years later in August 2023, Wayne Myers purchased Carl's Drug Store where it now serves the Greencastle-Antrim Community.

Carl's Drug Store is still the oldest, continuously operated drug store in the United States of America, celebrating its 200th anniversary in 2025.
