"Say, "Indeed, my prayer, my rites of sacrifice, my living and my dying are for Allah, Lord of the worlds." (6:162)

Hadith

It is narrated on the authority of Amirul Mu'minin, Abu Hafs 'Umar bin al-Khattab (ra) who said:

I heard the Messenger of Allah (**) say: "Actions are (judged) by motives (niyyah), so each man will have what he intended. Thus, he whose migration (hijrah) was to Allah and His Messenger, his migration is to Allah and His Messenger; but he whose migration was for some worldly thing he might gain, or for a wife he might marry, his migration is to that for which he migrated." [Bukhari & Muslim; 40 Hadith Nawawi 1]

Question 2: Guess Who?

It was narrated from 'Abdullah bin 'Amr bin 'As that the Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said: "He has succeeded who is guided to Islam and is granted sufficient provision and is content with it." (Sunan ibn Majah: English reference: Vol 5, Book 37, Hadith 4138)

In Makkah, she was one of the wealthiest in business, sending out caravans and hiring men to manage the sales. Twice married, many had asked for her hand in marriage. She had all the qualities one would hope for in a spouse. She would turn down the requests, until the day she met a man whose nobility and trustworthiness was known to all. She asked to marry him. Hadith

It was narrated from Abu Hurairah that the Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said: "Allah does not send down any disease, but He also sends down the cure." (Sunan ibn Majah; English reference: Vol. 4, Book 31, Hadith 3439)

Successful, wealthy, and of high character. Before the revelation began, he was always the close friend of Allah's Messenger .

Many successful and wealthy Arabs lived at his time, but he was destined to become something much more.

The first man to accept Islam. When he heard of the message, he did not ask a single question. He replied by bearing witness that there is no god but Allah, and that Muhammad # was His messenger.

He was with Rasul Allah in the cave during the Hijra.

Upon the prophet's sedeath, he fought to bring the entire ummah back to their deen. May Allah be pleased with him.

DAY 4

Question 1: Research and write an ayah from the Quran and/ or a Hadith related to the reminder below.

REMINDER: YOU CAN NEVER BE PERFECT

If perfection is your goal, then you have the lowest standards!

Why the lowest?

Because perfection cannot be achieved by any human being. Perfection belongs to Allah & alone!

Thus, if this is your standard, you will never achieve it, and then you will just give up. Instead, focus on what you are doing right, and keep growing that plant. And when, not if, when you do something wrong, something displeasing to Allah \$\mathstyle{\sigma}\$, bounce back immediately in Tawbah to Allah. Quickly come back and make things better. Those kind of people, those who come back to Allah \$\mathstyle{\sigma}\$ the fastest, are the most blessed children of Adam AS.

"And to Allah belong the best names, so invoke Him by them. And leave [the company of] those who practice deviation concerning His names. They will be recompensed for what they have been doing." (7:180)

"And [it is] an announcement from Allah and His Messenger to the people on the day of the greater pilgrimage that Allah is disassociated from the disbelievers, and [so is] His Messenger. So if you repent, that is best for you; but if you turn away - then know that you will not cause failure to Allah. And give tidings to those who disbelieve of a painful punishment." (9:3)

Hadith

Abu Huraira reported Allah's Messenger (ﷺ) having said: By Him in Whose Hand is my life, if you were not to commit sin, Allah would sweep you out of existence and He would replace (you by) those people who would commit sin and seek forgiveness from Allah, and He would have pardoned them." (Sahih Muslim 2749)





Question 2: Guess Who?

A young girl growing up in Makkah. Her mother was Khadijah, RA, and her father was Allah's chosen one \$\mathscr{\pi}\$. When she was 5 years old, her father came home to tell her that he had become a Messenger of Allah. By his side, although she was still a child, she followed his instruction and defended him again and again.

Her father married her to Ali RA, who was only a few years older than her. Together the young couple gave birth to AlHassan and then later AlHussain, the grandsons of Allah's Messenger . Her walk and speech reminded you of her father's . Rasul Allah said about her that she is the sayyidah of all women of paradise.

REMINDER: HOPE AND WORK FOR PARADISE

If one gets in their car and has no destination in mind, they will never arrive at the "nothing" in their mind.

You will never arrive if you don't know where you are going or take actions to get there.

Paradise is something that must be hoped for day and night. Those who enter Jannah are those who entered it 10000 times before they died. Because they hoped and prayed for it so much, they loved their lives striving towards it.

Envision yourself entering the highest level of Jannah! And now... work for it!

"And whoever does righteous deeds, whether male or female, while being a believer - those will enter Paradise and will not be wronged, [even as much as] the speck on a date seed." (4:124)

"But whoever desires the Hereafter and exerts the effort due to it while he is a believer - it is those whose effort is ever appreciated [by Allah]." (17:19)

Hadith

It was narrated that Umm Habibah said: "Whoever prays twelve rak'ahs in a day, a house will be built for him in Paradise." (Sunan an-Nasa'i 1810)

It was narrated from Abu Sa'eed Al-Khudri that the Prophet (*) said: "A hand span in Paradise is better than the earth and everything on it."

Question 2: Guess Who?

He was one of the most harshest against the Muslims. Not only would he torture his servants, but he would volunteer to inflict punishment on others who had accepted the message of Islam. Because of the way he and others treated the Muslims, they had to leave their homes and family and possessions so that they could worship Allah in peace. But who would have known?

The Prophet # made dua for his guidance and Allah accepted. The day he became Muslim it was a conquest for the believers. After the death of Abu Bakr RA, he became the Khaleefah. His rule was blessed with mercy to humanity. Many of us are Muslims today because of the countries conquered under his rule. If you speak about him, you speak about justice. He was promised paradise.

DAY 6

Let's say you don't "feel" like working for Jannah. Well then, let's introduce ourselves to Hellfire. There are only two destinations.

Everything in life is a gift of Allah, it's not "ours". It is a test to see if we will truly be thankful to Allah, by doing what He commanded and staying away from what He forbade. All these commandments are meant to raise us to be humans in the greatest mold. Anything less is subhuman.

Paradise or Hellfire? Your choice.

"O you who have believed, protect yourselves and your families from a Fire whose fuel is people and stones, over which are [appointed] angels, harsh and severe; they do not disobey Allah in what He commands them but do what they are commanded." (66:6)

Hadith

Ibn 'Umar reported Allah's Messenger (*) as saying:

When any one of you dies, he is shown his seat (in the Hereafter) morning and evening; if he is amongst the inmates of Paradise (he is shown the seat) from amongst the inmates of Paradise and if he is one from amongst the denizens of Hell (he is shown the seat) from amongst the denizens of Hell, and it would be said to him: That is your seat until Allah raises you on the Day of Resurrection (and sends you to your proper seat). (Sahih Muslim 2866a)

Question 2: Guess Who?

A young girl growing up in Makkah. Her father was wealthy and successful, but she saw him using all of that for the sake of Islam. On the day of Hijrah, she and her sister and her brother assisted Allah's Messenger and their father to escape. She was very young.

She was wed to Allah's Messenger and became his most beloved. She studied his home life intimately and became one of the most learned Muslims and narrators of hadith. There was a time when people in Madinah became suspicious about her, but Allah revealed her innocence from above seven heavens. She was the mother of all believers RA.

REMINDER: SOMEONE IS WATCHING ME

We tend to not disobey Allah "until" we think that no one is watching us. If only we knew.

The angels of Allah are watching us all the time, writing everything that we do.

Our very body parts that we use to obey or disobey are watching us and will testify on the Day of Repayment.

The earth that we walk on will bear witness to whatever we did on its back.

There is a book that records everything, small or large, that we do; if you read it you would be amazed! And above all, Allah is looking down on us. You are not alone.

"And the record [of deeds] will be placed [open], and you will see the criminals fearful of that within it, and they will say, "Oh, woe to us! What is this book that leaves nothing small or great except that it has enumerated it?" And they will find what they did present [before them]. And your Lord does injustice to no one." (18:49)

"Until, when they reach it, their hearing and their eyes and their skins will testify against them of what they used to do. And they will say to their skins, "Why have you testified against us?" They will say, "We were made to speak by Allah, who has made everything speak; and He created you the first time, and to Him you are returned." (41:20-21)

"When the two receivers receive, seated on the right and on the left. Man does not utter any word except that with him is an observer prepared [to record]." (50:17-18)

Hadith

It was narrated that Abu Sa'eed Al-Khudri said: "The Messenger of Allah [SAW] said: 'If a person accepts Islam, such that his Islam is good, Allah will decree reward for every good deed that he did before, and every bad deed that he did before will be erased. Then after that will come the reckoning; each good deed will be rewarded ten times up to seven hundred times. And each bad deed will be recorded as it is, unless Allah, the Mighty and Sublime, forgives it.'" (Sunan an-Nasa'i 4998)

Question 2: Guess Who?

Everyone in Makkah absolutely adored him. He was successful in business, with the most upright of character. When he became Muslim, there was no one to abuse him because of his noble status in society. But it was his own uncle that took it upon himself to inflict the punishment. Fleeing with his wife, he left his family, wealth and possessions in order to worship Allah in peace in Habasha.

Allah's Messenger married him to his daughter. And when she passed away, he married her to his other daughter. With the wealth that Allah paranted him, he purchased the well of Roma and prepared the army of alUsrah. In both cases, he was promised paradise in return. One cannot read about sadaqah anywhere without reading about his example.

We cannot just get up and be guided. Allah 48 has to grant us tawfeeq (favour) for that guidance.

When we attempt to come closer to Allah , the doors of guidance are opened and come closer, faster, to us. But we must never forget that it is Allah that allows this.

And if this heart we are seeking is in the hands of Allah , then lets take a moment right now and pray that Allah accepts this effort and grants us that nearness to Him, our Creator.

Upon him I have relied, and to Him I return." (11:88)

Hadith

Mu'awiyah (May Allah be pleased with him) reported: The Messenger of Allah said, "When Allah wishes good for someone, He bestows upon him the understanding of Deen." (Al-Bukhari and Muslim)

Question 2: Guess Who?

A very young boy in Makkah. The cousin of Allah's Messenger . Many children lived their lives in play and amusement, but not him. He was very close to Allah's Messenger , and never bowed his head to any idols.

Before the age of 10, he heard the news that Allah had chosen a Prophet from his family. He was the first amongst the youth to accept Islam. he grew to marry the daughter of Allah's Messenger , Fatima, RA. Later in his life, he became the Khaleefah of the Muslimeen. Promised paradise, his leadership was an example of pure courage.

The Arabic word for balance is 'Adl', also translated as justice! All our duties are important - family, business, studies, fitness, etc. In reality, when someone truly understands what Ibadah means, they will realize that in everything noble that one does, worship of Allah is found there. Think of 'ibadah' as something bigger. And enjoy.

"But seek, through that which Allah has given you, the home of the Hereafter; and [yet], do not forget your share of the world. And do good as Allah has done good to you. And desire not corruption in the land. Indeed, Allah does not like corrupters." (28:77)

Hadith

Narrated 'Aisha: Once the Prophet (*) came while a woman was sitting with me. He said, "Who is she?" I replied, "She is so and so," and told him about her (excessive) praying. He said disapprovingly, "Do (good) deeds which is within your capacity (without being overtaxed) as Allah does not get tired (of giving rewards) but (surely) you will get tired and the best deed (act of Worship) in the sight of Allah is that which is done regularly." (Sahih al-Bukhari, 43)

Question 2: Guess Who?

It was the son of AlWaleed, one of the strictest tyrants against the Muslims. When the drums of war against the Muslims began to beat, he was the leader of the disbelieving army. In the battle of Uhud, he saw the strategic mistakes some of the Muslims made and he capitalized on it. Over 70 companions of the Prophet were killed shaheed that day. Hamzah, the uncle of the Prophet he being one of them RA.

He accepted Islam and became a force for Allah , the sword of Allah . Never did he lose a battle, not before, nor after his Islam. When Abu Bakr RA sent him out in the apostate wars and then the subsequent battles in Iraq, he became the legend of what true Muslim leadership is all about. After all the battles he fought in, he passed away on his bed. He advised men to always be courageous for truly one never knows where they shall die.

DAY 10

If anything on earth reaches a state of excellence, it is the promise of Allah * that He will bring it back down to earth. Nothing on earth remains in the pinnacle state. And because of that, whenever we get something, when it's our day to 'boast', we should instead humble ourselves to Allah .

Imagine what life would be like if we loved each other, thought that everyone else was better than us in some way, and truly sincerely sought to treat people good because we truly sincerely hoped for Allah 's pardon.

Be humble. It feels so good.

"And We have already sent [messengers] to nations before you, [O Muhammad]; then We seized them with poverty and hardship that perhaps they might humble themselves [to Us]." (6:42)





"And the servants of the Most Merciful are those who walk upon the earth easily, and when the ignorant address them [harshly], they say [words of] peace," (25:63)

Hadith

Abu Huraira reported Allah's Messenger (**) as saying: Charity does not in any way decrease the wealth and the servant who forgives Allah adds to his respect, and the one who shows humility Allah elevates him in the estimation (of the people). (Sahih Muslim 2588)

Question 2: Guess Who?

As a chief of Makkah, he stood in the face of anything that the Messenger of Allah a called to. When the Muslims fled to Habasha, fleeing because of the punishment Quraish inflicted upon them, he set out with a delegation to Habasha to bring them back.

Allah squides whomever He wishes. He accepted Islam and became one of the guiding light leaders under the guidance of the Khulafaa'. Sent to North Africa, with seemingly small armies, he conquered country after country. If you are from North Africa, then this is one of the key man you must thank Allah for. Only Allah knows who shall be guided.

DAY 11

Question 1: Research and write an ayah from the Quran and/ or a Hadith related to the reminder below.

REMINDER: KEEP HOPE ALIVE. ALWAYS.

If you lose hope, you've already lost.

The test of life is too hard for us to enter it wishy-washy.

Be confident, strong, and determined in seeking Allah 's love, in seeking His paradise. This is what HE commands of us. It is not Allah that wishes to see us thrown in to Hellfire. Shaytaan is the one that wishes that end.

Allah wants us to be forgiven, wants us to be protected from Hellfire, wants for us to enter His paradise.

The question now is: what do we want? And what are we doing about it?

"O my sons, go and find out about Joseph and his brother and despair not of relief from Allah . Indeed, no one despairs of relief from Allah except the disbelieving people." (12:87)

"For indeed, with hardship [will be] ease. Indeed, with hardship [will be] ease." (94:5-6)

Hadith

On the authority of Abu Hurayrah (may Allah be pleased with him), who said that the Prophet (*) said: Allah the Almighty said: I am as My servant thinks I am (1). I am with him when he makes mention of Me. If he makes mention of Me to himself, I make mention of him to Myself; and if he makes mention of Me in an assembly, I make mention of him in an assembly better than it. And if he draws near to Me an arm's length, I draw near to him a cubit, and if he draws near to Me a cubit, I draw near to him a fathom. And if he comes to Me walking, I go to him at speed. (1) Another





possible rendering of the Arabic is: "I am as My servant expects Me to be". The meaning is that forgiveness and acceptance of repentance by the Almighty is subject to His servant truly believing that He is forgiving and merciful. However, not to accompany such belief with right action would be to mock the Almighty. It was related by al-Bukhari (also by Muslim, at-Tirmidhi and Ibn-Majah). (40 Hadith Qudsi, Hadith 15)

Question 2: Guess Who?

An Abyssinian slave in Makkah. It was a society that paid no moral heed to the slave class. They were bought and sold and bought again. They were not considered to be of higher intellect and had no wealth of their own. And rarely were they able to marry. He was one of them.

After accepting Islam, he was tortured in a way that few people could comprehend how he survived. He only called on one assistance: Allah . Abu Bakr RA freed him, and he migrated to Madinah. In Madinah, he became the Mu'adhdhin of Allah's Messenger, calling people to prayer five times a day. The Prophet once heard in a dream his footsteps in Paradise.

REMINDER: IN GOD ALONE WE TRUST

Do you have full conviction that Allah has the power to guide your heart to achieve its goal here?

If you are feeling a little doubtful, then silence the doubt, raise your hands, and make dua to Allah® to grant you the favor of achieving your heart's goal.

Narrated `Abdullah: We used to greet the Prophet (**) while he used to be in prayers, and he used to reply to our greetings. But when we came back from Najashi (the King of Ethiopia) we greeted him (while he was praying) and he did not reply to us. We said, "O Allah's Messenger (**)! We used to greet you in the past and you used to reply to us." He said, "Verily The Mind is occupied and busy with more important matter during the prayer." (So one cannot return One's greetings.) (Sahih al-Bukhari 3875)

When I love him I am his hearing with which he hears, his seeing with which he sees, his hand with which he strikes and his foot with which he walks. Were he to ask [something] of Me, I would surely give it to him, and were he to ask Me for refuge, I would surely grant him it. I do not hesitate about anything as much as I hesitate about [seizing] the soul of My faithful servant: he hates death and I hate hurting him. It was related by al-Bukhari. (40 Hadith Qudsi, Hadith 25)

But if they endeavor to make you associate with Me that of which you have no knowledge, do not obey them but accompany them in [this] world with appropriate kindness and follow the way of those who turn back to Me [in repentance]. Then to Me will be your return, and I will inform you about what you used to do. [And Luqman said], "O my son, indeed if wrong should be the weight of a mustard seed and should be within a rock or [anywhere] in the heavens or in the earth, Allah will bring it forth. Indeed, Allah is Subtle and Acquainted. O my son, establish prayer, enjoin what is right, forbid what is wrong, and be patient over what befalls you. Indeed, [all] that is of the matters [requiring] determination. And do not turn your cheek [in contempt] toward people and do not walk through the earth exultantly. Indeed, Allah does not like everyone self-deluded and boastful. And be moderate in your pace and lower your voice; indeed, the most disagreeable of sounds is the voice of donkeys." (31:14-19)

Hadith

On the authority of an-Nawas bin Sam'an (may Allah be pleased with him), that the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) said: Righteousness is in good character, and wrongdoing is that which wavers in your soul, and which you dislike people finding out about. [Muslim]

And on the authority of Wabisah bin Ma'bad (may Allah be pleased with him) who said: I came to the Messenger of Allah (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) and he (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) said, "You have come to ask about righteousness." I said, "Yes." He (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) said, "Consult your heart. Righteousness is that about which the soul feels at ease and the heart feels tranquil. And wrongdoing is that which wavers in the soul and causes uneasiness in the breast, even though people have repeatedly given their legal opinion [in its favour]." (40 Hadith Nawawi 27)

Question 2: Guess Who?

He was from the tribe of Dows. When At-Tofayl RA became Muslim and returned to his tribe of Dows to inform them, he was one of the first to answer the call and travel with At-Tofayl to visit the Prophet . He was single, without a wife or children, and his financial situation was destitute. Add to that, his own mother furiously cursed the Messenger of Allah

The Prophet schanged his name and later also prayed for his mother. That same day she became Muslim. He began narrating the sayings of Allah's Messenger s, so much so that he became the foremost narrator of hadith. Later in life, he was blessed with a wife, children and wealth and was appointed a governor at the time of Umar RA.

Your seeing for a man with bad sight is a charity for you, your removal of a rock, a thorn or a bone from the road is charity for you. Your pouring what remains from your bucket into the bucket of your brother is charity for you." (Jami at-Tirmidhi 1956)

His family was amongst the affluent of Makkah. Dressed in exquisite clothing, this handsome young man was admired by many. The expensive perfumes that he wore would linger in the air after he passed. In the midst of his youth and financial ability, he accepted Islam and became a Muslim.

Infuriated, when his mother heard the news that he became Muslim, she stripped him of everything. Physical torture was inflicted. After many years of this, he was sent to Yathrib as the "ambassador" of the Prophet . Most of the Ansar became Muslim at his hands. He was martyred in Uhud and they did not have a garment long enough to cover his entire body.

Abu Sa'id and Abu Hurairah (May Allah be pleased with him) reported that the Prophet (**) said: "Never a believer is stricken with a discomfort, an illness, an anxiety, a grief or mental worry or even the pricking of a thorn but Allah will expiate his sins on account of his patience". (Riyad as-Salihin, Book 1, Hadith 37)

He was blessed with a privilege that many of the Ansar wished they had.

When the Prophet are came to Madinah, he let his camel to stop wherever it wished and there he would stay until his residence was built. The camel stopped at his home!

Even at the age of 80 years old, he participated in the conquests at the time of the Khulafaa'. In the battle against Constantinople, he was critically hit. He told the others, "I urge you to penetrate deeply into the territory of the enemy as far as you can go, carry me with you and bury me under your feet at the walls of Constantinople." And then he was martyred.

Narrated AbuBakrah: When anything came to the Prophet (**) which caused pleasure (or, by which he was made glad), he prostrated himself in gratitude to Allah. (Sunan Abi Dawud 2774)

Abu Hurairah (May Allah be pleased with him) reported: The Messenger of Allah (*) said, "Any matter of importance which is not begun with Al-hamdu lillah (praise be to Allah) remains defective." (Riyad as-Salihin, Book 14, Hadith 2)

He was tall and strikingly handsome. There were few who had the kind of respect and influence in Makkah like him. He was one of the first people to accept the message of Islam at the hands of Abu Bakr. He lived through all the torture and trials of life in Makkah. In Badr, his own father followed him everywhere to kill him. Yet it was he who killed his father. A very great test!

During Uhud, he lost his teeth in his attempt to extract the metal that pierced the face of Allah's Messenger. At the time of the Khulaafa, he was the ameer of the Muslim army in AsShaam. During the plague of Omwas, he was martyred. At the time of Umar RA's death, Umar RA said that had he been alive, he would have appointed him to be the next khalifa.

Narrated Abu Musa Al-Ash`ari: Allah's Messenger (*) said, "The example of a Believer who recites the Qur'an, is that of a citron which smells good and tastes good; And the example of a Believer who does not recite the Qur'an, is that of a date which has no smell but tastes sweet; and the example of a hypocrite who recites the Qur'an, is that of an aromatic plant which smells good but tastes bitter; and the example of a hypocrite who does not recite the Qur'an, is that of a colocynth plant which has no smell and is bitter in taste." (Sahih al-Bukhari 5427)

Born to a fire-worshipping family, he ran away to join the Christians in AshShaam. From one Christian mentor to another, he served and learned the discipline of praying to God. Finally, the last of his mentors told him of a Prophet to soon come. He set out to find this Prophet, but on his way, he was sold into slavery. He was eventually sold to someone in Yathrib.

When the Messenger of Allah , migrated to Madinah, he was ready. After seeing the truthfulness, he became Muslim. The Muslims assisted him in freeing him from slavery. When others would show off their lineage, he would say, "Islam is my father! I have no other father!" Known for his knowledge and wisdom, some say it resembled that of Lugman.

Had Allah willed, He would have made you one nation [united in religion], but [He intended] to test you in what He has given you; so race to [all that is] good. To Allah is your return all together, and He will [then] inform you concerning that over which you used to differ." (5:48)

Hadith

Abu Hurairah (May Allah be pleased with him) reported: Some of the poor Emigrants came to Messenger of Allah (**) and said to him, "The wealthy have obtained all high ranks and everlasting bliss." He asked, "How is that?" They replied:





"They offer Salat as we do, and observe Saum (fasting) as we do, but they give in Sadaqah (charity) and we do not, and they emancipate slaves and we cannot." He (**) said, "Shall I not teach you something whereby you will catch up with those who have preceded you and will get ahead of those who follow you, and no one will surpass you unless he does the same as you do?" They said, "Surely, O Messenger of Allah." He said, "Say: Subhan Allah, and Allahu Akbar, and praise Him (by saying Al-hamdu lillah) thirty-three times at the end of every Salat." They returned to him and said: "Our brothers, the possessors of wealth, having heard what we are doing, have started doing the same." Messenger of Allah (**) said, "This is Grace of Allah which He gives to whom He wishes." [Al- Bukhari and Muslim]. (Riyad as-Salihin, Book 1, Hadith 573)

Question 2: Guess Who?

Abu Bakr RA was his good friend. When he heard of the message of Islam, he trusted Abu Bakr RA's choice and became Muslim himself. his mother used to cry for assistance in punishing him for becoming a Muslim. He lived through all the trials that the Muslims endured in Makkah.

In the battle of Uhud, because of the way he defended the Prophet , he was later known as the "living martyr." He was nominated at the time of Umar RA to be the next khalifa. After the death of Uthman, he felt so grieved that he said, "In what happened in the affair of Uthman, I did not think Allah would forgive me unless my blood was spilled in the path of avenging his blood." He was martyred in this path.

Hadith

Abu Musa Al-Ash'ari (May Allah be pleased with him) reported: The Prophet (**) said: "Allah, the Exalted, will continue to stretch out His Hand in the night so that the sinners of the day may repent, and continue to stretch His Hand in the





daytime so that the sinners of the night may repent, until the sun rises from the west". (Muslim) (Riyad as-Salihin, Book 1, Hadith 16)

Anas bin Malik Al-Ansari (May Allah be pleased with him) the servant of the Messenger of Allah narrated: Messenger of Allah (**) said, "Verily, Allah is more delighted with the repentance of His slave than a person who lost his camel in a desert land and then finds it (unexpectedly)". [Al-Bukhari and Muslim]. (Riyad as-Salihin, Book 1, Hadith 15)

Question 2: Guess Who?

He was promised Jannah during his life. He became a Muslim two days after Abu Bakr RA. It was the Prophet # who changed his name. He was tortured physically in Makkah and because of that, was amongst the companions who fled to Abyssinia to worship Allah in peace.

He returned in time to migrate with the Prophet ** to Madinah. There he was offered half his Ansari brother's wealth, but he chose to build his own. His business flourished immensely. He fought in Badr and Uhud, matching both physical and financial. In the battle of Tabuk, he gave everything he owned. After the Prophet ** death, he supported the wives of the Prophet *financially.

Hadith

Narrated Abu Huraira: Allah's Messenger (ﷺ) said, "If Allah loves a person, He calls Gabriel, saying, 'Allah loves so and so, O Gabriel love him' So Gabriel would love him and then would make an announcement in the Heavens: 'Allah has loved so and-so therefore you should love him also.' So all the dwellers of the Heavens would love him, and then he is granted the pleasure of the people on the earth." (Sahih al-Bukhari 7485)

He was a handsome and strong young man growing up in Makkah. Early twenties. From a rich and aristocrat family, he would spend his time practicing archery. Because of his strength, people used to call him the young lion. He found no worth to the idol worshipping that surrounded him, so on the day that Abu Bakr RA told him about the message of Islam, he became Muslim.

He was known as the uncle of the Prophet . His mother challenged his Islam and - as much as he loved her - he chose Islam over her, even if it meant she would take her life. He participated in Badr; and in Uhud he was one of the few that stood defending the Prophet . In the battle of AlQadisiyyah, he led the Muslim army to one of the most decisive victories over the 150K Persian army.
