

Dear Horsey Hundred Participants:

This news to use is mostly about your options for logistics and navigation during the event. We have an event experience app you can download onto your smart phone, links you can use to download maps to your cycling computer, and we will have hard copies of maps and cue sheets you can pick up at check in. We also have an outstanding road marking crew that is so good you could find your way without any of the previously mentioned navigation aids simply by following the colored arrows and signs. To find out more about your options and how to access them, continue reading. We've also included info for tandem teams and meeting up.

Designated Start Times – Social Distancing and Respect for All

With the relaxation of COVID requirements related to outdoor gatherings, and because we've split our routes early to help avoid congestion at the first rest stops, we will not be asking you to select a starting time. **HOWEVER**, our primary concern relating to COVID and social distancing remains congestion at the first rest stop since there will be less time for people to spread out along the route – We ask everyone to please do your part to be aware and to practice social distancing to the best of your ability. If our volunteers request you to do or not do something, please comply – and remember they are volunteers and are trying to keep everyone as safe as possible.




Download the Routes

Route Markings

There are several event rides and runs in our area, and thus there are places where numerous road markings exist. In some cases, we've blacked these markings out to prevent confusion, and in places where we think folks might be confused, we will also have signs.



On Saturday, the Century and 75 Mile routes are marked in the same color (YELLOW). There will be signage and additional road markings to distinguish the split of these two routes.


We will use WHITE arrows with "ALL ROUTES" to take riders out of Georgetown and bring them back into Georgetown from the last rest stops. Hazards will be marked in WHITE or have posted signs on the side of the road.

Below we've copied some photos of what our arrows look like on the road, and an explanation of how you'll see the arrows:



This photo illustrates "confidence arrows" – markings you'll see if you've been on a road for a while without a turn just to affirm you're still going the right way.

If multiple arrows are used for a particular route segment they should always be in the same order, green, orange, blue, and yellow indicating routes from shortest to longest distance.



This photo illustrates what you'll see if a right turn is coming up soon (the arrows indicating the turn will be at an angle, and there will be at least two of these types of markings leading up to the turn). Note that for purposes of the illustration, the yellow, blue and orange routes will be going straight, while the green route will turn right.

This photograph illustrates the last marking before you will actually be turning. Note that the arrow is directly sideways in this case for the green route. There will also be confirmation arrows similar to the confidence arrows above indicating the routes after the intersection. In this case you can expect an orange, blue, and yellow arrow after the intersection straight ahead and a green arrow after the right turn.

Tandem teams who'd like to ride together on Saturday or Sunday should plan to meet at the Tandem Banner at 7:45 AM each morning. The banner will be conveniently located near the ride starting area.
