YOU NEVER KNOW WHO YOU'LL MEET ON THE COURT

We reported in the last issue of AROUND THE POST that silver medal winners of the Women's 3.5 Earth Day tournament were sisters Kellie Gunner and Jolie Franciscus. For most of us that would have been the highlight of the tournament - by far. But for Kellie, it was not nearly as emotional as seeing a familiar name on the opponent's line of the score card before a mixed doubles match in the same tournament.



The player was a just a *wee bit* taller than she recalled (maybe 2+ feet) with a bit more hair (okay, quite a bit) than she remembered, but Kellie thought she recognized him from her classroom, years ago. "Is your last name Marvin?" she cautiously asked the tall man with a beard. "Yes", he answered. "Is your first name Dustin?". "Yes". Then, suddenly, "It's me! Mrs. Gunner!" And, so began a very emotional impromptu reunion between a retired teacher and her 3rd grade student from decades ago.

The pickleball match became secondary for both but Dustin prevailed with his aunt as his partner. Kellie admits losing focus and appreciates Greg Davis's forgiving nature.

Kellie remembers the young Dustin as her secret favorite student who always tugged at her heartstrings. A kind, smart personable kid from a nice family.

For his part, Dustin remembers Mrs. Gunner as kind and caring. To this day he recalls the warm look on her face when she returned to him a spelling test with a good grade. "I remember feeling so proud and thankful because of the compliment she gave me." Today, Dustin is an elementary school Vice Principal who will soon become the Principal. If you've ever questioned the impact a teacher can have on a student, here's what Dustin thinks: "Even though I was just in 3rd grade when I first met Mrs. Gunner, there is no doubt in my mind that the Lord used her to shape me into the man I am today. I don't know if I would have the passion for serving elementary age students if it weren't for her."

You never know who you'll meet on the pickleball court. It could be the person who changed your life. Or maybe someone whose life you changed.
