Dear Members and Friends of First Pres. Chippewa Falls

We are in uncharted territory with the Coronavirus. It requires some difficult choices for all of us. Therefore, out of an abundance of caution, and after conversations and correspondence with most of the churches in Chippewa Falls, the Session reluctantly has decided to cancel worship services **AT LEAST** through the end of March. During this time, Sunday services, Bible study, Wednesday night suppers and choir rehearsal will be cancelled.

The Food Pantry will remain open for now, but probably on a limited basis, and will make their own decisions whether to remain open or close. The Open Door Clinic will remain open on a limited basis. Church staff will be on hand to answer questions but the church building itself will be locked.

We hope to resume services on Palm Sunday, April 5. Session will make a decision after March 29 regarding Palm Sunday. Communion will not be served either on Palm Sunday or Easter.

For those of you who are homebound, the Deacons will be contacting you by phone, but if you need something, you may contact Margi at 715-720-8926.

We would encourage particularly those of you who live alone to contact the church if you are ill or need help. You may live alone but you aren't alone. We are all family and families take care of each other.

You will receive further information on this closure in future EBells.

In the meantime, stay safe, and be well. This too shall pass.

#### ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICE AND FISH FRY DEEMED SUCCESSES

Once again the Presbyterian Men outdid themselves at the annual Fish Fry commemorating Ash Wednesday. The dinner raised over \$470 for PM projects and it was planned so well, there was only a very small amount of food left over.

There were between 70 and 80 people at the Ash Wednesday service which netted \$418 for CareLink. This year we included the congregation from Christ Episcopal Church in our worship. This brought together the three original denominations which met together over 100 years ago.

## FOOD PANTRY REMAINS OPEN

During this crisis, our Food Pantry remains open on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 10 to noon. Our procedures change daily as this is a very fluid situation. In the future, we will not let our clients into the church. We will meet them outside to deliver food.

Our volunteers will fill a bag with shelf-stable food, one with produce and meat, and another with breads and baked goods. Coupons for eggs and milk will be placed in an envelope and stapled to the bag. If dairy is available, volunteers will add that to the bag.

A volunteer will take the cart with the food bags outside to a client who may then take the cart to his car and return the empty cart to the church where will be immediately sanitized. Unwanted items may not be returned to the church.

Bonnie Gullickson made masks for volunteers to wear if they are outside with clients. We are wearing gloves and using a lot of disinfecting wipes as well. The safety of our volunteers and of our patrons is of utmost importance to us.

We want to continue to serve the needy in our community but do not want to unduly jeopardize anyone's health. If we feel we are putting anyone at risk, we will close the pantry. For now, we feel these procedures are the best way to serve our clients during this time of uncertainty.

# CHOIRS JOIN FOR EASTER SERVICES

Easter Services at Trinity United Methodist Church and our church will be extra special this year. The two choirs will be joining to sing praises to the Lord under the direction of Methodist director, Bill Bocian.

The services will be held at their regular time but the order of worship may be changed so both choirs can participate in both services.

# MENOMONIE SINGERS TO PERFORM AT FPC

The Menomonie Singers under the direction of Amy Vogt will perform Mozart's Missa Brevis in D Major and other choral selections in our sanctuary on April 25 at 2:30. This will be the choir's third visit to our church.

While these performances carry no ticket fee, the choir suggests a \$10 donation to defray expenses.

The Missa Brevis (brief mass) consists of six movements, and was the first of Mozart's works to appear in print. It is thought to have been composed for liturgical use in the Salzburg, Austria, cathedral where Mozart was employed by the Archbishop Colloredo. The Archbishop demanded brevity and concision in this mass; none of the movements has an orchestral introduction, and Mozart composed it for a very limited instrumental ensemble. Originally scored for two trombones, and strings for accompaniment, The Menomonie Singers will use only strings, and a piano.

In addition, the choir is selling raffle tickets to raise money for future projects. Items donated to be raffled off are a stay at Cobblestone Suites in Menomonie, a silver and Alexandrite ring designed by Humphrey Gilbert, a handmade "moon" quilt, tickets to the Guthrie, the Ordway, the Pablo Center, the Mabel Tainter and Menomonie Theater Guild. The drawing will be held at the Duke and Dagger at 5 pm on April 26. Ticket purchasers need not be present to win.

The choir is always looking for new members. Auditions will be held again in August with rehearsals beginning again shortly after to prepare for concerts in the fall. Interested singers should contact Juliana Schmidt, Executive Director and founder, at <u>themenomoniesingers@gmail.com</u>.

# NEWS FROM THE MISSION TEAM...

Best wishes to all of you from the Mission Team. We hope that you are doing well during these trying times. We need to pray for each other and remain hopeful. The Mission Team met on March 12. I will share with you the highlights of that meeting and speak about our Lenten Special Offering, One Great Hour of Sharing. I also copied an update from the Presbyterian Mission of the Presbyterian Church (USA) regarding OGHS and the COVID-19 pandemic.

The contributions from Presbyterians for the OGHS are used in three programs. The italicized items are copied from the Leader's Guide for the OGHS Special Offering.

- **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance** (32% of \$): Works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters, and support for refugees.
- **Presbyterian Hunger Program** (36%): Takes action to alleviate hunger, care for creation, and the systemic causes of poverty as all may be fed.
- Self-Development of People (32%): Invests in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues.

#### The Presbyterian Mission regarding OGHS and the COVID-19 pandemic.

During this time of crisis, with the COVID-19 pandemic threatening, we are reminded that the most vulnerable in our midst suffer first, most and longest. One Great Hour of Sharing has, for over 70 years, supported the most vulnerable among us. Because of our support, the Church is able to deepen its commitment to serve. In the days ahead, staff of Self-Development of People, the Presbyterian Hunger Program and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance will be working with presbyteries to identify and support essential congregational ministries, especially in antipoverty work. The Church's response to the present crisis will begin with the most at-risk communities across the country and around the world, as well as those facing spikes of racism in response to this disease.

Through One Great Hour of Sharing, a special offering of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), we extend shelter to those who have no place to stay, offer compassion to those who have pain be it physical, emotional, or spiritual—and we set a feast, with God, for those who lack access to enough food to eat. During these uncertain times, we depend on our Church, faith, family and God's grace to see us through. Please give generously to One Great Hour of Sharing. We are the Church, together.

Thank you for your contributions to the following mission endeavors. You make a difference.

- You contributed \$562 to the Christmas Joy Offering.
- You contributed \$414 during the month of January for the Carelink promotion. This will purchase sixteen \$25 gas cards.
- You contributed 50 items for Lather with Love which we were able to distribute through our own Food Pantry. In addition, the Food Pantry received 200 items from the 1,095 combined totals of items donated through the efforts of Mission Coalition churches.

## FPC TO BUY EASTER LILIES

Once again the church will order a dozen Easter lilies which will adorn the sanctuary on Easter morning. These flowers can be purchased by the congregation as we have done in the past.

# **ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING**

A special offering for One Great Hour of sharing will be taken on Easter Sunday. This ministry supports three programs – Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, which provides relief to those affected by disasters, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, providing food for the hungry and Self-Development of People which gives support toward the self-development of poor and oppressed communities.

32% of these funds go to helping restore communities after disasters while 36% goes to reducing hunger and the remaining 32% to providing resources and education to oppressed and disadvantaged communities.

If you would like to participate in this offering, you can make your contribution anytime during April. Donation envelopes are available in the bulletin and pews.
