#### TREASURER'S REPORT ON CHURCH FINANCES

Editor's Note: Over the years one of the greatest complaints we have heard is a lack of financial information. In an effort to correct that problem, our Treasurer, Carla Ingalls, has agreed to write regular articles on our finances for the Bell as well as speak to the congregation as requested. She does give detailed financial statistics to Session every month but that doesn't get passed on to the congregation. Our plan is to change that so you will know where we stand.

#### Financial State of the Church

At this point in 2023, we have a budgetary shortfall of \$13,870.00. We projected an annual shortage of \$27,000.00 or more so we are right on track per our projection.

Our income is down and our expenses are considerably higher than anticipated, mostly due to the maintenance issues with our beautiful but aging church building. Although we have reserve to cover this for 2023, depleting our reserve to this extent is not sustainable in the long term (longer than five years).

We have approximately 20 regular giving units - that is individuals or families who contribute regularly. To meet our budgetary goals for 2023, we would need an additional \$26.00 per week from each of you.

Pastor Ed has been calling on current and past members encouraging them to return to the church which would result in more contributions. He is also looking for possible new members to add to our family. In addition we ask each of you to review the contribution you make to the church. In many cases, this amount hasn't changed in several years. While we certainly appreciate what you give, our expenses have risen and it takes more money to keep us going. Your help is essential to keep our church alive.

You are a very strong and generous body of members and have, without exception, provided for all the needs of this congregation and its mission for many years. We ask that you give prayerful consideration to how best your time, talent and money can help sustain and grow this beautiful church.

Presbyterian Women and Presbyterian Men have each pledged \$200 to provide a grocery bag of non-perishable items like what we give out at our Food Pantry. We are partnering with Valley Vineyard to provide these bags of food to participants at Love Chippewa.

LOVE CHIPPEWA provides services that many of the poor in our community cannot afford. Some services offered include haircuts, car care, medical/dental/vision checks to name a few. These services are provided by volunteers from many fields of expertise.

#### NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

National Night Out comes to the Northern Wisconsin Fairgrounds on August 1. Sponsored by the Chippewa Falls Police Department, the event will run from 5 to 8 this year and was originally intended to acquaint the community and particularly the children with the police officers.

The event has grown to include businesses in the community. FPC will have a table and will be distributing information on our mission programs, focusing on the Food Pantry and the Open Door Clinic.

#### FPC TO CHOOSE GIFTS TO HELP OTHERS

As we discussed in last month, the July 30 Noisy Sunday offering will go to purchasing a gift from the Presbyterian Giving Catalog.

The gifts fall into five categories – kits and tools, people, water, livestock and agriculture and they include family and community farm bundles, sewing machines, fishing nets, fishing boats and accessories, water filters, a deep rock well, nutrition packs, chickens, a cow, a pair of goats, seeds, farming tools and even a community garden.

Some of these items are beyond our means to provide, but we can help with their purchase. Other items are well within our means.

Once we see how much money Noisy Sunday generates, the Mission Team will select several gifts and present them to the congregation in August to vote for the one or more that appeal to you.

Without those funds from Presbytery, we might not have Ed because he might not have completed his studies to become a CRE.

#### PURE WATER DAYS SERVICE TO BE AUGUST 13

Mark your calendar for the ecumenical service in Irvine Park in conjunction with Pure Water Days...

The service will be held at the band shell in the park beginning at 9:00 AM on Sunday, August 13 and will include Trinity United Methodist, Our Saviour's Lutheran, First Presbyterian, Central Lutheran, Christ Episcopal, Zion Methodist and Lake Hallie Methodist churches making it a truly ecumenical service.

Communion will be served, water will be poured in keeping with the theme of Pure Water Days and there will be traditional music. As if planned, the Gospel lesson for that Sunday involves Christ walking on water. The sermon will be delivered by Pastor Ed Williams.

There are benches at the band shell but many people choose to bring folding chairs or blankets to sit on the hill. The earlier than usual schedule should mean than the sun won't shine as brightly on worshippers making for a more pleasant morning.

In case of rain (Mother Nature wouldn't dare) the service will move to Our Saviour's parking lot where they are already set up for services by car radio.

There will be no regular service as FPC that Sunday.
