WE'VE COME A LONG WAY BUT THERE'S STILL WORK TO BE DONE

When you think about it, we have come a very long way since the dark days of 2019-2022. We weathered the Covid pandemic. Sure, we were closed for in-person worship for part of that time, but we fared much better than many churches, some of which never opened again to in-person worship. We learned how to navigate our way around Zoom. We were fortunate to have dedicated guest pastors who kept us on the straight and narrow and dedicated volunteers who kept the church running and functioning even without a pastor. But all that is behind us. It's time to move forward.

With Pastor Ed Williams at the helm, the church is once again resuming its place in the community. Many of the church teams have resumed their regular meetings and functions. Our Wednesday night suppers have started up again, albeit only once a month, but it's a start with the promise of more to come. The choir although small is back on a limited basis. The Food Pantry continues to provide meals for the needy. And the need grows but that's one of the reasons we are here "in the city for good."

While the growth of our programs is a blessing, it comes with a cost and that is something we have to address sooner rather than later.

Costs of everything have risen – from gas to groceries to health care and utilities. I know they have grown for you as they have for our family. And they have grown for the church too. We have cut our expenses to the bone. Presbyterian Women and Presbyterian Men have stepped up to help with finances but we still are in need. And we need everyone's help.

Many of us, me included, have continued to give to the church but not many of us, again me included, have increased our contributions from where they were in 2019. Now is the time to take a close, hard look at those contributions in light of what the church is doing and wants to do in the future.

Pastor Ed has big plans for the church. He has vowed to increase our membership. And we are moving in that direction. He has brought in new guests and people we haven't seen for far too long. He is trying new things, some of which work, a few of which don't. But he keeps trying. His enthusiasm is infectious.

Pastor Ed needs us and our contributions to continue to do what needs to be done in the community. We have waited so long for him and the faith he has shown in us. We can't let him down because if we do we aren't holding up our end of the deal. It's time – past time – to GIVE.

After many years of wear and tear, the cement on our main ramp developed holes and buckled where the sections meet. These imperfections had become hazardous to those of us using that ramp and the time came to repair the cement.

Presbyterian Men solicited bids from contractors and decided on Advanced Concrete in Mondovi to do the work. Fortunately they were able to start in mid-October so the ramp has been repaired and the bill for almost \$1000 paid by PM.

On Christmas morning, Agnes' Table will host a brunch in Fellowship Hall. The community will be invited.
