The other event was the Love Chippewa, Free Clinic on September 16. Local churches served between 125 and 150 people who just needed some additional help. This event used to be called "Touched Twice" but was brought under the envelope of "Love Chippewa" which was founded in the wake of the tragic death of the Girl Scouts in November, 2018 and the Lily Peters murder in 2022. Local churches got together to help the community members deal with their grief. With the Covid Pandemic, the churches stopped getting together and talking about community problems that churches could help with. With the return of the Free Clinic, it gave our local churches the opportunity to get back together again, not in a time of tragedy, but just to help the local community, as disciples of Jesus Christ. Love Chippewa is looking to find a way to provide more events and fill more needs in our community.

## HOW THE ENDOWMENT AND OPERATING CHURCH WORK TOGETHER

I've been asked what the Endowment fund is and how it works.

Our First Presbyterian Church is funded by weekly, monthly, or annual donations from friends and members, by earnings from Presbyterian Women's events, earnings from Presbyterian Men and yearly earnings from the Endowment.

The church is registered with the I.R.S. as a 501(c)3 organization identified as "The Presbyterian Church". E.I.N. # 39-0852153. The Endowment is registered with the I.R.S as "The First United Presbyterian Church of Chippewa Falls". A 509(c)(5) organization with E. I. N. # 39-1272793.) Each must file an I.R.S. informational tax return every year.

During the pandemic, resulting financial disruption and conflicting language with the by-laws caused principal and interest of the Endowment Fund to be mixed. The principal, also known as the base amount, of the Endowment is perpetual and CANNOT be used for church operations. Annual interest earnings from the base can be used.

A revised set of by-laws will be submitted for approval at the annual Congregational Meeting in December. The revision sets the <u>base</u> as \$150,000.

For a gift to become part of the Endowment base, it must clearly state it is to be used to increase the Endowment. Gifts and donations to the Presbyterian Church can be used for daily operations.

The Endowment trustees have determined the base of \$150,000 is a correct amount. A considerable amount of work has been done to "right the ship" as they say.

#### STAINED GLASS PIECE RETURNS HOME

When Dr. Robert Koenig left FPC in 1985, his parting gift was a special stainless glass piece crafted by Eau Claire artist, Laurie Bizee. While there is some question about the spelling of the artists name, there is no doubt she was a strong influence in the art of the Chippewa Valley to the extent that there is even a Laurie Bieze (note different spelling) Gallery at the Pablo Center at the Confluence.

In Dr. Koenig's will, he stipulated that the glass piece be returned to FPC where it has been installed in Fellowship Hall.

The original plan was to mount it to the wall across from the large stained glass window but apparently the wooden studs were replaced during the church remodel and steel posts added. Those posts made it very difficult to actually attach the piece to the wall so Gene Peissig made a small stand to take the weight of the glass. The piece is also attached to the wall for stability.

When Dr. Koenig's family can join us, the stained glass will be officially dedicated. Until then, it stands for us to enjoy.
