### ASH WEDNEDAY AND LENT HAVE SPECIAL MEANINGS

Lent is a solemn religious observance in the Christian liturgical calendar that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends approximately six weeks later, before Easter Sunday.

The purpose of Lent is to prepare the believer for the resurrection of Jesus on Easter. It is heightened in the annual commemoration of Holy Week, marking the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus, which recalls the tradition and events of the New Testament beginning on Palm Sunday, further climaxing with Jesus' crucifixion on Good Friday, which ultimately culminates in the joyful celebration on Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6, is traditionally described as lasting for 40 days, in remembrance of the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the desert, according to the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, before beginning his public ministry, during which he endured temptation by Satan.

These 40 days of Lent are marked by fasting, both from foods and festivities, and by other acts of penance. Today Lent may be marked by helping the poor and needy. It may include something as seemingly simple as helping your neighbor remove snow from his driveway or bringing his groceries into the house. In addition, some believers add a regular spiritual discipline, to bring them closer to God, such as reading a Lenten daily devotional

Ash Wednesday itself is a day focused on prayer, fasting, and repentance. Ashes are ceremonially placed on the foreheads of Christians on Ash Wednesday. The words (based on Genesis 3:19) used traditionally to accompany this gesture are, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Ashes were used in ancient times to express grief. When Tamar was raped by her half-brother, "she sprinkled ashes on her head, tore her robe, and with her face buried in her hands went away crying" (2 Samuel 13:19). The gesture was also used to express sorrow for sins and faults. Today Christians continue the practice of using ashes as an external sign of repentance.

At FPC we observe the beginning of Lent with the Ash Wednesday fish fry and service including communion and the imposition of ashes.

During Lent, the traditional color used in the sanctuary is purple, however, several years ago Jeannette Miller made special Lenten paraments, banners and communion linens of beige muslin to commemorate the solemn season leading up to Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday. You will see those in the sanctuary beginning on Ash Wednesday.

# ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

A special offering for One Great Hour of sharing will be taken on April 21. Easter Sunday. This ministry provides relief to those affected by disasters, food for the hungry and support toward the self-development of poor and oppressed communities.

32% of these funds go to helping restore communities after disasters while 36% goes to reducing hunger and the remaining 32% to providing resources and education to oppressed and disadvantaged communities.

If you would like to participate in this offering, you can make your contribution anytime during the Lenten season. Donation envelopes will be available in the bulletin and pews during Lent.

The choir from the Methodist church will join our own Celebration Singers under the direction of Methodist choir director, Bill Bocian, to provide special music for this evening service.

Many thanks to our Methodist friends including Pastor Terri Koca, who has prepared the service and will preach and choir director, Bill Bocian, who selected the anthem and will direct the choirs.

# PRESBYTERY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The Presbytery of Northern Waters held its Winter Stated Meeting at the Lakeside Presbyterian Church, Duluth on Saturday, February 2, 2019.

Vice Moderator Chris McCurdy offered to conduct a brief orientation for first-time commissioners, but none were present at that time. We plan to continue this tradition so that new commissioners have a better chance to understand what goes on at the Presbytery Meeting.

The featured speaker was the Reverend Robyn Weaver, pastor of the Glen Avon Presbyterian Church, Duluth. She led a workshop on Active Listening encouraging us to be aware of blocking techniques that keep us from truly hearing what others are trying to communicate and helping us to use other language to be sure we understand.

We also had a presentation by the Reverend Doug Paulson, ELCA, Director of the Twin Ports Seafarers who assist foreign ship crews with their needs, including spiritual needs, while in port.

The Reverend Karen Schuder spoke on behalf of the Self Development of People Committee (SDOP) about projects that are eligible for funding and about two local projects in particular: SDOP is one of the recipients of the One Great Hour of Sharing special offering annually. The Reverend Jim Deters, co-chair of the Committee on Ministry (COM), plans to write a letter encouraging all pastors and Ruling Elders to participate in the governance of the more inclusive Councils of the church, particularly the Presbytery. Attendance by both pastors and commissioners of the churches needs to improve.

The Overtures and Bylaws Committee (O&B) recommended approval of an addition to the Manual of Operations to make it clear who has the authority to approve expenditures from the Presbytery portion of the Peace & Global Witness special offering. The Presbytery approved giving this authority to the Presbytery Council which has now approved a \$2,000 grant from this fund for The Express Yourself project.

All the amendments to the PCUSA Constitution proposed by the 223<sup>rd</sup> General Assembly were approved by the Presbytery except for amendment 18-C.

Treasurer Jay Wilkinson spoke to the year-end financial statements and to the written report submitted by Finance & Budget Committee Chair Bill Gravelle. We ended the year with a deficit of \$5,810 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$4,245. The primary reason is due to the poor performance of investments in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2018 which led to the first yearly loss on investments in several years.

Currently Presbyterian Men serve the Wednesday breakfast for the Optimist Club in Fellowship Hall. This is an ongoing fund-raiser for them.

The Food Pantry operates on Tuesday and Thursday mornings with deliveries from Feed My People on Tuesday mornings as well.
