



Legend

Trail markers in the forest are the same colour as indicated on the map.
Trail names are found on signs at all trail intersections.

Trails with solid lines are wide enough for the Rhino side by side



Dotted lines are only wide enough for walking.



Light grey dotted lines are future trails to be developed and sometimes marked with blue flagging tape.



Solid red dots on the trees are property boundary lines and only where there are no fences.



Solid yellow dots indicate trees that can/should be cut.

Light blue shaded areas are vernal ponds with water only in the spring and early summer.

This dotted line — . . — . . — . . — is a split rail fence. One runs through the middle of the property

Trees with a blue band (hemlock trees and white pine trees) or a yellow band (Sugar maple) around the stem indicate trees being protected and will not be cut.



Upside down trees are places where you will see downed trees from the Derecho Storm on May 21, 2022.
