POINT TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS REGULAR SUPERVISORS MEETING TUESDAY, APRIL 13, 2021

The Point Township Board of Supervisors held their regularly scheduled meeting on the above date at the Point Township Municipal Building for Supervisors and employees and remotely for residents, 759 Ridge Road, Northumberland, PA. Present were: Chairman Randall W. Yoxheimer, Vice-Chairman Montie E. Peters, Supervisor Joseph Stender, Sr., and Supervisor George Geise. Also, present were Solicitor Richard J. Shoch, Chief of Police Craig Lutcher, Secretary/Treasurer Amanda McClain and Office Clerk Amy Hoffman, and Roadmaster Jared Wehry. (Supervisor James Neitz Sr – Absent)

Chairman Yoxheimer welcomed everyone to the Supervisors meeting and all present repeated the Pledge of Allegiance. Executive Session:

The Board of Supervisors held an executive session until 7:22PM to discuss a legal matter.

Approval of Minutes:

MOTION made by Peters to approve the minutes of the Regular Supervisors Meeting held on Tuesday, March 9, 2021. Seconded by Stender and passed with a vote of four (4), one (1) absent – Neitz.

REPORTS: (Old & New Business included):

Solicitor:

- Status on Purdue Pharma:

Received paperwork, lots of steps. We will not take direct action, just monitor.

- Approval of Rental Ordinance 2021.02:

Need to get fee established, won't enforce until the fall. Need hearing board set up, they do not need to be residents in the Township, but need to have code or construction background. Will check with Keystone COG to see if this is something they could provide.

Yoxheimer I taxed Neitz with finding members, so far he has one.

Shoch we won't be enforcing right away, we will give people until fall, or late fall to get applications in **MOTION** made by Yoxheimer to adopt the Rental Ordinance 2021-02. Seconded by Stender and passed with a vote of four (4), with one (1) absent, Neitz.

MOTION made by Yoxheimer to allow the Solicitor to check with Central Keystone COG about appeal board for the Rental Ordinance. Seconded by Stender and passed with a vote of four (4), with one (1) absent, Neitz.

- Consent to sell Repository Property:

We will eventually have two lighted intersections, \$600 per intersection for maintenance. Approx. \$60 per month, per intersection for electric.

MOTION made by Peters to allow the sale of the Crown Vic to the Northumberland County Sheriff Department in the amount of \$2,500. Seconded by Stender and passed with a vote of four (4), with one (1) absent.

Derr not sure if the water company can check for the leak. I have spoken with people in Sunbury that has said PA American water will come find the leak.

Yoxheimer asked Derr to look into the cost of replacing the pipes.

- Portable Toilets at Park:

Derr most organizations that use the park have given money toward the potable toilet, just waiting to hear back from soccer.

- 5K Fun/Run at Sunbury Christian

MOTION made by Yoxheimer to retroactively approve the 5K race at Sunbury Christian and send a letter to release the Township from liability. Seconded by Peters and passed with a vote of four (4), one (1) absent – Neitz.
