POINT TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS REGULAR SUPERVISORS MEETING TUESDAY, APRIL 12, 2022

The Point Township Board of Supervisors held their regularly scheduled meeting on the above date at the Point Township Municipal Building, 759 Ridge Road, Northumberland, PA. Present were: Chairman Randall W. Yoxheimer, Vice-Chairman Montie E. Peters, Supervisor James Neitz, Sr. Supervisor Joseph Stender, Sr. and Supervisor Thomas Strouse, Jr. Also, present were Solicitor Richard J. Chairman Yoxheimer welcomed everyone to the Supervisors meeting and all present repeated the Pledge of Allegiance. Approval of Minutes:

MOTION made by Peters to approve the Meeting minutes from the Regular Supervisors Meeting on March 8, 2022, the 2nd Public Hearing for the Zoning Ordinance and Map Amendment on March 15, 2022, and the Special Meeting held on March 15, 2022. Seconded by Neitz and passed unanimously.

Solicitor:

- <u>Review of tax claim sale properties</u>: received a schedule, as we do from time to time, from County of properties that are being sold.
- <u>Approval of Revised Floodplain Ordinance 2022-02</u>: from time to time the Ordinance gets updated to reflect new State and FEMA guidelines, so people who do live in a floodplain can get affordable insurance.

- <u>Paving Bids for around Township Building</u>: Sealed Bids that came in: Gutelius \$38,017.50; JD Feaster \$39,434.10; G&R Charles \$39,800.95; Fairchild \$41,966.00; Riteway \$43,929.30; and New Enterprise \$49,900.00

MOTION made by Yoxheimer to accept the lowest bid with Gutelius for \$38,017.50, conditioned on the Solicitor reviewing documentation. Seconded by Peters and passed unanimously.

- RACP Audit, May 12 & 13: once the audit is complete, the remaining balance will be deposited.
- Keystone Insurance/Dividend Check (\$12,006.18): letter was read from Ed Koebke
- <u>Martins Change Order #2/Pass-through window for offices being renovated for the Sewer Authority:</u> NEIC is giving the Township \$2,000.00 towards the cost.

MOTION made by Yoxheimer to approve change order #2 from Martins Construction for \$3,750. Seconded by Peters and passed unanimously.

- <u>Cory Johnson/Northumberland County Infrastructure monies</u>: Cory is working with County in the sharing of the County's Infrastructure monies, of which we are getting \$200,000 toward the Kapp Heights/Growing Greener project.
- <u>Durex Flooring for PD</u>: the flooring has been completed, which was funded by a grant through Northumberland National Bank.

Yoxheimer gave his appreciation to the Secretary for getting the funding for the PD floor.

Yoxheimer lots of things moving through here: Press release regarding Encina; damaged guiderail on Cannery Road; possibly purchasing pipe for the Kapp Heights project (we will not bid until we know we have all the pipe).

Road Department: (Report on File)

- <u>Lahrs Road</u>: looked at some of the worst spots on Lahrs, measured and got some numbers back to fix the worst areas and do some patch work. The stone will be around \$7,000, and about \$20,000 for tar and chip. The grinding and grading will be done in house.

MOTION made by Yoxheimer to allow the Roadmaster to proceed with Lahrs Road repairs, not to exceed \$30,000. Seconded by Peters and passed unanimously.

Yoxheimer asked the Roadmaster his time frame for Mountain Road?

Wehry I just talked to Chris from Conservation District, he said they are taking the proposal for pipe work to their Q&A board, early this summer, he didn't give a time frame.

Yoxheimer how are you on materials for that?

Wehry nothing right now, once I knew what Conservation was willing to do and then get prices. (*Discussion ensued*)

Hart spoke with Kauffman and has been working with her, she provided the deed, after reviewing it, I saw that Keefer and Associates did her survey for her, I called them today and they are going to get me a copy of the survey. Our stance in this, I am not a certified surveyor, none of us are, this becomes a civil issue.

Yoxheimer what it will come down to, the Township may give their opinion after the survey is reviewed, but it becomes a civil issue.
