ORDINANCE NO. 2026-04

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF POINT, COUNTY OF NORTHUMBERLAND, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA PROHIBITING THE DEPOSITING OF GRASS CLIPPINGS, MUD OR OTHER DEBRIS ON PAVED PUBLIC STREETS, ROADS OR HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP AND PROVIDING FINES AND PENALTIES IN CONNECTION THEREWITH .

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors in and for the Township of Point, Northumberland County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

1. UNLAWFUL TO DEPOSIT

It shall be unlawful for the owner or lessee of lands located in the Township, or their agents or contractors, to (a) blow or otherwise deposit grass clippings onto any paved public street, road or highway located in the Township or to (b) permit a vehicle to be driven or moved from any private road or driveway located upon lands of such owner or lessee onto any paved public street, road or highway so as to deposit upon such paved street, road or highway, mud, dirt and/or debris from the tires and/or undercarriage of such vehicle.

2. EXCEPTIONS

The provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to persons or entities while engaged in commercial agricultural activities or municipal-directed roadway ditch or right-of-way maintenance.

3. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

Any person or entity violating Section (1) or this Ordinance upon notification of such violation shall within six hours of such notification immediately remove the grass clippings, mud, debris or dirt from the public street, road or highway. Any person or entity who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance, upon conviction thereof shall be guilty of a summary offense, and shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$1,000.00 plus costs, including reasonable attorney's fees incurred by the Township and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, to a term of imprisonment to the extent permitted by law for the punishment of summary offenses. A separate offense shall arise for each day or portion thereof in which a violation is found to exist. The Township may also commence appropriate actions in equity or other to prevent, restrain, correct, enjoin, or abate violations of this Ordinance.

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4. SEVERABILITY

If any sentence, clause, phrase, or section of this Ordinance is, for any reason, found to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality, or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, sections, or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intention of the Board of Supervisors that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid sentence, clause, phrase, section, or part thereof not been included therein.

5. REPEALER

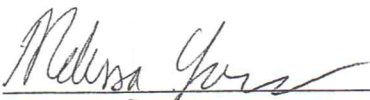
Any other Ordinance or parts thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be and are hereby expressly repealed.

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its enactment.

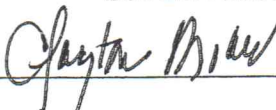

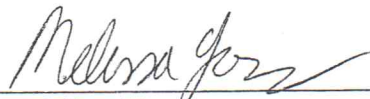
