The following parade rules and guidelines were established in an effort to ensure the safety of all parade entrants and spectators. They further assist in keeping the parade moving at a consistent pace while maintaining a traditional parade atmosphere, which we all enjoy and expect.

General Participant Rules

- All participants MUST pre-register by June 17TH, 2022;
- Distribution of items other than candy is not permitted (i.e., no fliers, coupons, etc.);
- Candy throwing from vehicles/floats is not permitted. This is a liability issue. To distribute candy, you must have at least two designated candy-walkers (walk on both sides of float on the white lines of each road edge). Candy-walkers must keep pace with the vehicle/float. This is an important child safety issue;
- Bullhorns are not permitted (The use of a sound system must be approved by the Committee in advance);
- Water-propelling devices and/or water balloons are not permitted (i.e., no squirt guns or super-soakers);
- All animal entries must be followed by participant-supplied cleaning personnel;
- Vehicles/Floats must keep pace with the parade. Stopping a vehicle/float causes gaps and delays for spectators. All participants are expected to continue to move forward and keep pace. The parade route continues to the Canfield Middle School Parking lot (Stopping prior to the Middle School can cause the entire parade to come to a stop).

Dignitary Participant Rules

- Any and all signs used should designate the office held or sought by the dignitary/candidate.

Parade Rules/Guidelines – Compliance

These rules and guidelines were established to enhance the safety and enjoyment for everyone involved. Thanks to participants' compliance we have had great parades for many years and have not had any injuries. To ensure compliance with Parade Guidelines, committee members and police officers will again be stationed along the parade route. Failure to comply with the Parade Guidelines may result in: Immediate removal from the parade route; and/or Exclusion from participation in future parades.
