**MANHASSET PARK AND PARKING DISTRICT**  
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## Preamble

The Manhasset Park and Parking District (hereinafter referred to as "MPD") was created by ordinances duly adopted by the North Hempstead Town Board at meetings duly Convened, pursuant to N.Y.S. Town Law 130 and 198, subs (4) and (5), as augmented by section 319.12 of the Nassau County Civil Divisions Act, as amended; was duly delegated, by the North Hempstead Town Board to the MPD Board of Commissioners via resolutions duly adopted at meetings of the Town Board duly convened in Manhasset, New York; the Park District on July 5, 1921 and the Parking District on July 13, 1948. In the exercise of this Authority an ordinance styled "Manhasset Park District Automobile Parking Field Revised Ordinance" was duly proposed by the Manhasset Park District Board of Commissioners. A notice, published pursuant to Town Law 130, heralded a public meeting to convene in MPD were invited to attend and to condone or commend the proposed "Revised Ordinance". Thereafter, the proposed Revised Ordinance, as corrected, was duly adopted. That enactment provided for the preservation of the peace, health, and safety of the citizens in the MPD, by the orderly movement of traffic into and out of the automobile parking fields operated by the MPD. That Revised Ordinance may be augmented by supplemental rules and regulations, duly adopted by the Board of Commissioners.

## SECTION 1-1.01 - Definitions

Certain words as used in this ordinance shall have definite connotations:

- (a) "**Automobile**" shall include any motor vehicle designed, used or operated primarily for the transportation of persons not for hire.
- (b) "**Automobile parking space**" shall mean an area as outlined on the pavement of each automobile parking field, within which an automobile must be positioned to be legally parked.
- (c) "**Bus**" shall include any motor vehicle designed, used or operated as an omnibus with a seating capacity in excess of seven passengers, in addition to the driver, for the transportation of persons for hire.

- (d) **“Commuter”** shall mean any person who travels via the Long Island Railroad Manhasset station.
- (e) **“Emergency vehicle”** shall mean any motor vehicle designed, used or operated by a fire department, fire marshall, sheriff or deputy sheriff, police department or police officer, or any law enforcement agency or officer engaged in the performance of the duty of a peace officer.
- (f) **“Meter”** shall mean the mechanical or electronic device placed, installed either at each automobile parking space in several automobile fields to accept money and to register the duration any automobile may park in the designated automobile parking space.
- (g) **“Merchant”** shall mean any person who owns, operates or manages a shop, store, retailer or similar business within the MPD.
- (h) **“Motor Vehicle”** shall include any self-propelling device, used and operated for the surface transportation of either persons or property.
- (i) **“National Holiday”** shall mean New Years Day, Martin Luther King’s Birthday, Presidents Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.
- (j) **“Operator”** shall mean every individual who drives a motor vehicle either as the owner, or as an agent, employee or permittee of the owner.
- (k) **“Park,” “parking,” or “parked”** shall include, any motor vehicle in any MPD automobile field either stopped, or stationary, or standing, whether attended or unattended by an operator.
- (l) **“Pedestrian”** shall mean any person afoot.
- (m) **“Person”** shall include a natural person, proprietorship, association, co-partnership or corporation.

- (n) **“Reserved Automobile Parking Space”** shall include any automobile parking space in any MPD automobile parking field designated as reserved for the exclusive use by an automobile owner by either the proprietor, or an employee, of any local commercial enterprise or establishment.
- (o) **“Shopper”** shall mean any person who visits stores for purchasing or examining goods or services.
- (p) **“Stop”** shall include any halt, momentary, of any motor vehicle, whether attended or unattended by an operator.
- (q) **“Student”** shall mean any person who is formally engaged in learning or is enrolled in the Manhasset High School.
- (r) **“Taxicab”** shall include any motor vehicle designed, used or operated as an omnibus with a seating capacity of not more than seven passengers, in addition to the driver, for the transportation of persons for hire.
- (s) **“Traffic”** shall include any pedestrian, motor vehicle, or other conveyance, either individually or collectively, using any MPD automobile parking lot.
- (t) **“Traffic Infraction”** shall include any violation of either any provision of this “Revised Ordinance” or any duly adopted augmenting rules and/or regulations.
- (u) **“Truck”** shall include any motor vehicle designed, used or operated primarily for the transportation of property.

### **SECTION 1-2.01 - Enactment**

This ordinance shall be known and cited as “The Manhasset Park District

Automobile Parking Field Revised Ordinance” effective in Manhasset, New York; on \_\_\_\_\_. In the event of any inconsistency between the provisions of this Ordinance and any prior Ordinances, the provisions of this Ordinance shall govern.

### **SECTION 1-3.01 –Parking Field Identification**

The MPD Parking Fields represent the MPD’s acquisition via title or any other property interest including through ownership, lease or any similar agreement to accommodate and facilitate automobile parking for Manhasset residents, commuters, shoppers and merchants. These areas, established as MPD automobile Parking Fields, are distinguished by number as hereafter enumerated:

- (1) Railroad station plaza and Manhasset Avenue north, or field #1. That area bounded on the north by the LIRR right of way; on the east by Plandome Road; on the south by Maple Street and by privately owned land; and on the west by privately owned land, all of which is adjacent to the Manhasset Railroad station; that area bounded on the north by railroad station plaza; on the east by a gasoline station; on the south by Manhasset Avenue; and on the west by privately owned property;
- (2) [This section has been omitted. Field #2 via previous Ordinances has now become incorporated as part of field #1]
- (3) Manhasset Avenue south, or field #3. That area bounded on the north by Manhasset Avenue; on the east by North Hempstead Town Park (Mary Jane Davies Green); on the south by Memorial Place and privately owned property; and on the west by land registered in the name of Union Free School District #6;
- (4) Locust Place West, or field #4. That area bounded on the north by Colonial Parkway; on the east by Locust Place; on the south by privately owned property; and on the west by privately owned property;
- (5) Locust Place east, or field #5. That area bounded on the north by Manhasset Medical Building; on the east by privately owned land improved as retail stores; on the south by privately owned land ; and on the west by Locust place.

(6) George Street, or field #6. That triangular area bounded on the north by George Street; on the east by land owed by the Community Reformed Church; on the south by land owned by the Community Reformed Church; and on the west privately owned land improved as retail stores.

(7) Hillside Avenue, or field #7. That triangular shaped area bounded on the north by Hillside Avenue; on the south by LIRR right-of-way; and on the west by Myrtle Street.

(8) Verizon Parking Lot, or field #8. The northerly line of the parking lot on the property located at 30 Myrtle Street, Manhasset, New York; bounded on the west by Myrtle Street and on the south by Hillside Avenue (The Verizon Parking Lot).

Each of these automobile parking fields (with the exception of field #8) is more accurately delineated on a map entitled "Location Map of MPD Parking Fields in Manhasset, New York, dated Monday, the 8<sup>th</sup> of July, 1996," which is incorporated into and made a part of this revised ordinance.

### **SECTION 1-3.02 - Parking Field Use**

Each MPD automobile parking field has been constructed with appropriate means of entrance and exit, through traffic lanes, artificial lighting, automobile parking stalls, and/or meters. Legible directions shall be posted at each automobile parking field as to proper use of that facility, e.g., the type of authorized automobile parking, the charge for the automobile parking; denomination of acceptable currency; limits on the duration of such parking; plus any additional instructions as might aid in the regulation and safe use of such fields.

### **SECTION 1-3.03 – Parking Field Solicitation**

It shall be unlawful for any person to post, distribute or cast brochures, flyers, handbills, circulars or advertisements or other materials for solicitation purposes in any MPD park or parking field or upon on any motor vehicles within any MPD park or parking field. Peddling, soliciting or vending of any type is prohibited within a



park or parking field, except as authorized by the Board of Commissioners.

### **SECTION 1-4.01(a) - Parking Field Signs**

The movement of vehicle traffic and pedestrians into, through, and out of each MPD automobile parking field shall be governed by such appropriate traffic control signs, as posted. These traffic control signs shall be posted or otherwise displayed as depicted on the accompanying layouts of the individual parking field and shall be binding. This Revised Ordinance shall be augmented by traffic control signs as well as any hand signals or oral instruction given authorized personnel.

- (i) A **“No Parking”** sign indicates that vehicles may not park at the particular location at any time. A vehicle **may** stop to load/unload packages or merchandise at curbside and stop to expeditiously drop off or pick up passengers.
- (ii) A **“No Standing”** sign indicates that vehicles may not stand at the particular location at any time. A vehicle **may not** wait or stop to load/unload packages or merchandise at curbside. However, a vehicle **may** stop to expeditiously drop off or pick up passengers.
- (iii) A **“No Stopping”** sign indicates that vehicles may not stop at the location at any time. A vehicle **may not** wait or stop to load/unload packages at any time. Additionally, a vehicle **may not** drop off or pick up passengers at any time.

### **SECTION 1-4.01(b) - Parking Field Control**

No motor vehicle shall enter any MPD automobile parking field other than via a designated entrance nor depart other than via a designated exit. No motor vehicle, within any automobile parking field shall operate in violation of any applicable NYS Vehicle Traffic Laws and/or MPD traffic control signs. No motor vehicle shall stop, stand, or park in any traffic lane. No motor vehicle shall operate in any MPD automobile parking field at a speed in excess of 15 miles per hour. No taxicab, bus

or commercial motor vehicle shall stop, stand or park in any MPD automobile field other than in a designated area.

**SECTION 1-4.02(a) - Parking Field Type**

(i) **COMMUTER PARKING FIELD.** No automobile shall park in the railroad station plaza and the Manhasset Avenue North (field #1)) and South (field #3) between the hours of 6:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. on any Monday through Friday, excluding national holidays unless a MPD resident automobile parking permit is affixed to the left rear bumper and a valid receipt must be displayed on the left dashboard or shelf forward of the steering wheel positioned so that the printed time and date is clearly legible from the exterior of the automobile. No automobile shall park in any automobile parking space beyond the time printed on the receipt.

(ii) **SHOPPER PARKING FIELD.** No automobile shall be parked in the Locust Place West (field #4) and East (field #5), between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 9:00 P.M. on any Monday Through Saturday, excluding national holidays, unless sufficient money has been inserted either in the applicable parking meter, or other time controlled device. No automobile shall park if, either i) the pertinent meter displays the word "expired" or "violation", or ii) the meter flag displays only the color "red", or such meter clock shows the time to be "0:00" or "00:00" and such is in full view on said meter. Notwithstanding unexpired parking time shown on any meter dial for a vacant automobile parking space, no motor vehicle shall park in that space unless operator deposits an appropriate coin in the meter. No person shall insert or attempt to insert in any meter, any slug, device or other substitute for a valid coin minted by the United States of America. The maximum parking time for legal continuous parking in any shopper parking field or any one metered parking space in any shopper parking field shall be limited and restricted to a period of not longer than three (3) consecutive hours.

(iii) **MERCHANT PARKING FIELD.** No automobile, other than the automobile duly registered with the MPD, shall be parked in any reserved

automobile parking space established in the Locust Place West (field #4), Locust Place East 4), George Street East (field #6), Hillside Avenue (field #7) and Verizon Parking Lot (field #8), between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 9:00 P.M. on any Monday through Saturday, excluding national holidays. Furthermore, the appropriate MPD bumper sticker must be affixed on the left side rear bumper of the designated automobile.

### **SECTION 1-4.02(b) - Restriction Against Unqualified Automobile Parking**

No person shall park their automobile in any MPD automobile parking field unless the operator or passenger of that automobile is using the particular parking field for the exclusive purpose that the field was designed for, as described in Section 1-4.02(a) and posted on the M PD sign for the particular field. No person shall park in the commuter parking field (Section 1-4.02(a)(i)) for the sole or exclusive purpose of using the commuter parking field as a substitute for parking at the Manhasset High School.

### **SECTION 1-5.01- Manner of Parking**

No motor vehicle shall park in any MPD automobile parking field unless:

1. Positioned wholly within a single automobile parking space;
2. The engine is stopped;
3. The ignition system is off and locked;
4. The gear is set in park;
5. The ignition key is removed;
6. The brakes are set; and
7. All doors are closed and locked;

No unauthorized motor vehicle shall park in any area designated for fire, emergency vehicles, or other area restricted by law. No motor vehicle shall park outside a single automobile parking space. No motor vehicle shall protrude or extend or otherwise obstruct either a traffic lane or an adjacent automobile parking space.

### **SECTION 1-6.01(a) - Violations**

Any person who causes a motor vehicle to violate any provision of this Revised Ordinance or any person who aides or abets therein, shall be guilty of committing a traffic infraction. Any person who shall cause a motor vehicle to be in violation of any provisions of this ordinance for an uninterrupted twenty four (24) hour period, or any person who aids and abets therein, shall be deemed in violation of this Revised Ordinance. Each twenty-four hour period shall constitute a separate offense. Any motor vehicle which remains in any MPD automobile parking field for longer that thirty six consecutive hours with no such current MPD receipt properly displayed shall be deemed abandoned.

### **SECTION 1-6.01(b) - Presumptions**

Each motor vehicle which enters, operates upon and/or parks in any MPD automobile parking field is presumed to have been, operated and/or parked by its registered owner.

### **SECTION 1-7.01 - Enforcement**

Any NYS Trooper, Nassau County Police Officer, North Hempstead Constable, MPD Enforcement Officer, duly authorized police or governmental enforcement officer is authorized to take any and all appropriate action needed to effectively enforce any provision of this Revised Ordinance or any rule or regulation adopted pursuant thereto. Any citations issued by such enforcement officers for any alleged violations of either the Revised Ordinance or any augmenting rule and or regulation shall be returnable in the appropriate Term of the Nassau County District Court, or a Justice of the Peace, or other agency duly authorized under the laws of the state of New York to adjudicate such matters. Any and all fines levied for any violations of this ordinance and/or rule or regulation adopted pursuant thereto shall be remitted to the Manhasset Park District.

### **SECTION 1-7.02 - Penalties**

(a) The registered owner and/or operator of any motor vehicle in violation of

this ordinance or any augmenting rule or regulation shall be guilty of a traffic infraction. The conviction by either Nassau County District Court Judge, a Justice of the Peace, or other agency/authority duly authorized under the laws of the State of New York to process and adjudicate such matters, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars, plus interest and/or penalties, or in default of payment of such monies, by imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty days.

**(b) Booting of Unauthorized Vehicle.**

(i) The MPD may, without the consent of the owner or operator of an unauthorized vehicle, cause a boot to be installed on the vehicle in the parking field between the weekdays of Monday through Friday if the vehicle has remained in the parking facility unlawfully for more than 24 consecutive hours.

(ii) A boot operator that installs a boot on a vehicle must affix a conspicuous notice to the vehicle's front windshield or driver's side window stating:

- (1) that the vehicle has been booted and damage may occur if the vehicle is moved;
- (2) the date and time the boot was installed;
- (3) the name, address, and telephone number of the booting company;
- (4) a telephone number that is answered 24 hours a day to enable the owner or operator of the vehicle to arrange for removal of the boot;
- (5) the amount of the fee for removal of the boot and any associated parking fees; and
- (6) notice of the right of a vehicle owner or vehicle operator to a hearing.

(iii) On removal of a boot, the boot operator shall provide a receipt to the vehicle owner or operator stating:

- (1) the name of the person who removed the boot;

- (2) the date and time the boot was removed;
- (3) the name of the person to whom the vehicle was released;
- (4) the amount of fees paid for removal of the boot and any associated parking fees; and
- (5) the right of the vehicle owner or operator to a hearing.

(iv) The booting company shall maintain a copy of the receipt at its place of business for a period of three years. A peace officer has the right, on request, to inspect and copy the records to determine compliance with the requirements of this section.

(v) A booting company shall accept payment by an electronic check, debit card, or credit card for any fee or charge associated with the removal of a boot. A booting company may not collect a fee for any charge associated with the removal of a boot from a person who offers to pay the charge with an electronic check, debit card, or credit card form of payment that the booting company is not equipped to accept.

(c) The registered owner and/or operator of a motor vehicle shall be liable for the payment of any fine or penalty imposed for any violation of this ordinance and/or any rules and regulations adopted to augment the ordinance.

(d) The registered owner of the motor vehicle, when not the operator, shall be jointly and severally liable with the operator as if such vehicle was used or operated with the permission of the owner, expressed or implied.

(e) In the computation of any time period within which any act under this Revised Ordinance must be performed, the date of issuance of the appearance ticket (Summons) shall not be included. If the last day of the period is a Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, the period shall be extended until the next business day.

## **SECTION 1-8.01 - Removal of Vehicles**

Any motor vehicle in any MPD Automobile Parking Field, so as to constitute a hazard, or obstruct the flow of traffic, or in violation of any provision of this ordinance, or of any rule or regulation adopted to augment this ordinance may be impounded and towed from the automobile parking field by the MPD, its agents or employees. The vehicle may be towed to and stowed in a garage, automobile pound, or other approved location. Prior to the release of the vehicle, either the registered owner, or other person lawfully entitled to possession of such impounded vehicle, shall pay the applicable fine plus any charge for the automobile removal and storage.

## **SECTION 1-9.01 - Commuter Automobile Parking Field Permit; Qualifications**

Commuter automobile parking field permits, as authorized by the Board of Commissioners, may be issued to residents of the MPD. Each commuter automobile parking field permit, in the form of a sticker, shall be physically affixed by MPD personnel to the left rear bumper of the applicable automobile. Any such commuter automobile parking field permit shall become void upon the termination of the valid MPD residence and/or the divestment of his/her registered ownership in the vehicle. Any such automobile parking field permit may be voided upon the persistent violation of this "Revised Ordinance" either by the resident owner, or by the motor vehicle.

## **SECTION 1-9.02 - Commuter Automobile Parking Field Permit; Applications**

Any MPD resident who desires to obtain a commuter automobile parking field permit must complete a written application by providing full, accurate and current factual information. The MPD resident must sign and date the application and file it with the MPD Board of Commissioners. The representations and factual information set forth in each application shall be augmented by such documentary proof as required to establish both the applicant's residence within the MPD and that the motor vehicle is registered within the MPD. Additional or supplemental information may be required to substantiate the continuance of the residence of the

applicant or the vehicle registration address during the period for the validity of the permit. An application fee, not to exceed \$100.00, may be imposed by the Board of Commissioners. Applications may only be submitted in person at the MPD office between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Monday through Friday and the last Saturday of each month between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

**SECTION 1-9.03 – Weekend Commuter Automobile Parking Field Permit; Qualifications**

Any Commuter who is issued a parking field permit pursuant to Sections 1-9.01 and 1-9.02 of this Revised Ordinance shall be deemed exempt from this Section. Any Commuter who is a MPD Resident who does not have a permit pursuant to Sections 1-9.01 and 1-9.02 of this Revised Ordinance shall be entitled to obtain up to two (2) weekend parking permits from the MPD for use in the MPD parking fields as described herein. Each weekend commuter automobile parking field permit, in the form of a sticker, shall be physically affixed by MPD personnel to the left rear bumper of the applicable MPD Resident's automobile.

Any other person who parks a motor vehicle in the MPD commuter parking fields shall be deemed a nonresident Commuter. All nonresident commuters shall pay a fee for the use of any MPD commuter parking field between the weekend hours of Friday at 6:00 p.m. through Sunday at 10:00 p.m. The fee shall be determined by the meters and/or signs posted in the applicable parking fields.

**SECTION 1-9.04 - Merchant Automobile Parking Field Permit; Qualifications**

Merchant automobile parking field permits, as authorized by the Board of Commissioners, may be issued to merchants of the MPD. Each merchant automobile parking field permit, in the form of a sticker, shall be physically affixed by MPD personnel to the left rear bumper of the applicable automobile(s). The MPD will issue up to five (5) permits for each single parking space allotted to the each merchant and that merchant's employees. Merchant automobile parking permits are only valid for the numbered parking space for which they were issued and are invalid for any other parking space. Any such merchant automobile parking field permit shall become void upon the expiration of the one year term for which it



was issued. Any such automobile parking field permit may be voided upon the persistent violation of this "Revised Ordinance" by the merchant and/or that merchant's employees.

### **SECTION 1-9.05 - Merchant Automobile Parking Field Permit; Applications**

Any merchant and/or that merchant's employee(s) who desire(s) to obtain a merchant automobile parking field permit must complete a written application by providing full, accurate and current factual information. The merchant and/or that merchant's employee(s) must sign and date the application and file it with the MPD Board of Commissioners. The representations and factual information set forth in each application shall be augmented by such documentary proof as required to establish the applicant's employment within the MPD. Additional or supplemental information may be required to substantiate the continuance of the applicant's employment during the period for the validity of the permit. An application fee, not to exceed \$1,000.00, may be imposed by the Board of Commissioners. The payment for the application fee shall be a check from the applicant's business account only. No personal checks will be accepted. Applications may only be submitted in person at the MPD office between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Monday through Friday.

### **SECTION 1-10.01 - Risk Awareness**

Any motor vehicle is parked in any MPD automobile parking field at the peril of the registered owner. Any loss or damage caused by fire, theft, or other destructive force is at his/her risk. The Manhasset Park District, its servants, agents or employees assume no responsibility for the safe-keeping of either the motor vehicle or any property therein.

### **SECTION 1-11.01 - Rules and Regulations**

(a) The Manhasset Park District Board of Commissioners by resolution may change or establish, the permissible hours and/or time limits for parking in any automobile parking field or any automobile parking space. The Board of Commissioners by resolution, shall establish and alter, the rates or fees to be

charged for automobile parking in the various fields and the denominations of coins or bills to be accepted in the payment of any such charges.

(b) The hours, time limits, and rates, plus such other regulations adopted by the Manhasset Park District Board of Commissioners, shall be posted and/or otherwise promulgated by signs either at the entrances or amendment may apply. Upon being duly adopted, any such regulation or amendment shall become part of this ordinance, by reference, with the same force and effect as if it were specifically set forth herein.

## PARKS AND RECREATION

### **§ 2-1. Hours.**

Unless different hours are otherwise posted by order of the Board of Commissioners, all parks, fields and playgrounds owned by the MPD shall officially be closed from one hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise. No person shall be permitted to enter, pass through, gather in, sleep in, loiter, congregate or otherwise remain in any part of any MPD park, field or playground during the aforesaid curfew period or remain therein at any time after having been directed to leave by a police officer. The above provisions shall not apply to any activity specifically authorized by the Board of Commissioners to be conducted during said periods.

### **§ 2-2. Alcoholic Beverages, Smoking and Littering Prohibited.**

The bringing upon or the drinking of liquor, beer, wine or other alcoholic beverages in any MPD park, field or playground is hereby prohibited. The smoking or use of any tobacco or illegal drugs in any MPD park, field or playground is hereby prohibited.

No person shall throw, distribute or deposit litter in any MPD park, field or playground except in public receptacles and in such a manner that the litter will be prevented from being carried or deposited by the elements upon any part of the park or upon any street or other public place. Where public receptacles are not provided all such litter shall be carried away from the park by the person responsible for its presence and properly disposed of elsewhere.

### **§ 2-3. Private Use.**

No person or group shall use any park, field or playground for private use without first obtaining the approval of the MPD Board of Commissioners through a resolution adopted by the MPD Board of Commissioners.

### **§ 2-4. Dog Walking and Dog Waste Prohibited.**

The bringing upon of any dogs, cats or similar domestic pets in any MPD park, field or playground is hereby prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any dogs, cats or similar domestic pets to defecate, urinate or commit a nuisance in any MPD park, field or playground. A person owning or possessing a dog, cat or similar domestic pet which defecates, urinates or commits any nuisance as prohibited herein, with or without the knowledge, consent or fault of such person, shall be guilty of a violation of this section. The owner or possessor of any dog, cat or similar domestic pet shall immediately remove all feces deposited by said pet by placing such feces in a plastic bag which shall be sealed and deposited in a covered garbage receptacle.

#### **§ 2-5. Motor Vehicles Prohibited.**

The bringing upon of any motor vehicles in any MPD park, field or playground is hereby prohibited.


#### **§ 2-6. Penalties for Offenses.**


A violation of any of the provisions of this chapter is hereby declared unlawful and a petty offense. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter or refuse or neglect to comply with any order made thereunder shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine. The conviction by either Nassau County District Court Judge, a Justice of the Peace, or other agency/authority duly authorized under the laws of the State of New York to process and adjudicate such matters, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars, plus interest and/or penalties, or in default of payment of such monies, by imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty days. Each day upon which such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. Any such violation shall constitute disorderly conduct, and the person violating this chapter shall be a disorderly person.
