## BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MANHASSET PARK DISTRICT REGULAR MEETING OCTOBER 3, 2022

Meeting 22-17

The bi-monthly regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Manhasset Park District (MPD) convened at the Manhasset Park District Office at 62 Manhasset Avenue in Manhasset, New York at 6:15 P.M. Monday, October 3, 2022. Present were Commissioners Mark S. Sauvigne, David Paterson and Kenneth Weigand. In addition, Andrew Schwenk and Catherine Dillan, Residents and Amanda Niewender, Secretary to the Board of Commissioner were also present. Paul Pepper, MPD Legal Counsel called into the meeting.

Numerous communications addressed to the MPD pertaining to a wide array of matters were reviewed and discussed and eventually disposition was made to those, which warrant action.

- 1. Approval of Minutes from Previous Meeting
- 2. <u>Payment and Receipts</u> The following resolution was proposed:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners for the Manhasset Park District approved payments as follows:

Checks numbered 10514-10524 totaling \$4,608.72 to be reviewed, approved and signed and Payroll Amounts of \$21,031.60 for Payroll 10/6/2022 and all totaling \$25,640.32.

On a voice vote, this resolution was unanimously approved.

## 3. Catherine Dillan

Ms. Dillan came to the Board meeting to request that we life the fee to park on the weekends for everyone. She feels since it was implemented in 2014, people choose to park on her street rather than to park in the lot. She also feels the Park Avenue businesses are all given approval to open without the proper parking requirements which lead to more vehicles on her street. She had spoke to the Town of North Hempstead, which lead her to us. The Board discussed the issue with her. Without significantly raising taxes to the MPD residents, the supplemental income from the weekend fees helps to keep the MPD budget on track. They understand that street parking is an issue and discussed with her how the MPD has been trying to obtain an IMA with the TONH for many years to provide more enforcement. Mr. Schwenk chimed in and suggested she reach out to their councilperson, Veronica Lurvey.

4. Nonresident assessment

The Board reviewed the numbers of commuter parkers in the lot. With some email complaints regarding nonresident parkers by the residents, the Board will continue to monitor and further discuss before making any more extensions into 2023.

## 5. <u>Ralphs incident report</u>

Ralph had an altercation with an uber driver in the lot, the police were called and a report was issued. The uber driver stole Ralph's glasses. The Board agreed to pay the costs of the glasses.

## 6. Next Meetings

Amanda reported the TONH has proposed the budget hearing to be October 20<sup>th</sup>. The Board will keep the October 17<sup>th</sup> meeting and meet on the 20<sup>th</sup> before going to Town Hall.

Having no other items on the agenda, Motion was made by Kenneth Weigand to adjourn the meeting. Motion seconded by David Paterson and all voted "aye".
