Dear Members of the SCCS Community,

As we close another incredible year, I'm filled with gratitude for the families, staff, donors, and community partners who make our mission possible. It is an honor to lead SCCS into its 20th year of operations and present to you our first annual impact report.

Last year, we achieved significant milestones with your support — we served **475 children**, nurtured strong relationships with families, and upheld our promise to provide **consistent, high-quality care** — even in the face of challenges felt across the childcare sector.

We're especially proud that **89% of children in our Pre-K classrooms met kindergarten readiness benchmarks**, a clear reflection of the expertise, dedication, and joyful work that our educators bring to our programs each day. Beyond numbers, we see the impact in small moments: the first time a toddler says “thank you,” the pride in a preschooler showing off their artwork, or the trust in a parent's voice when they drop off their child.

In a time when accessible, stable childcare is more important — and more uncertain — than ever, we've been able to maintain **low staff turnover**, strengthen our internal culture, and continue offering care that families count on. That stability is not accidental; it's the result of thoughtful investment in our people, our values, and our long-term vision.

As we look to the year ahead, we're focused on growth: expanding our programs in new neighborhoods, supporting our team's professional development, and deepening our role as a community anchor. As we work into 2026 and witness growing cuts to educational funding, we know there will be challenges. Our commitment to children, families and our staff remains resolute. Though the landscape may shift, our mission will not.

To our donors, partners, and families: **Thank you for believing in our mission.** Your support makes it possible for hundreds of children to enter school confident, curious, and cared for. And to our Board of Directors and Staff- Thank you for walking alongside us. Your partnership fuels the work we do every day.

Sound Child Care Solutions (SCCS) was founded in 2006 with a deep belief that all children deserve high quality, culturally relevant education, and tackling the divide between who gets great education and who doesn't is critical to reducing the school readiness and academic achievement gaps.

As the first early learning, shared services consortium in Seattle, our unique organization empowers directors to focus on social-emotional and academic outcomes for children, and professional development for teachers while the Central Office supports critical business functions.

Our Model

A shared services model for early learning offers numerous impactful benefits that strengthen both program quality and organizational sustainability. Our priorities are guided by the experiences and expertise of educators, and the families that participate in our services.

The SCCS model centralizes administrative tasks and collaborates on essential services to reduce cost and free up directors to focus on children and families. SCCS teachers also benefit from shared access to professional development and specialized support which enhances learning environments and promotes consistent quality.

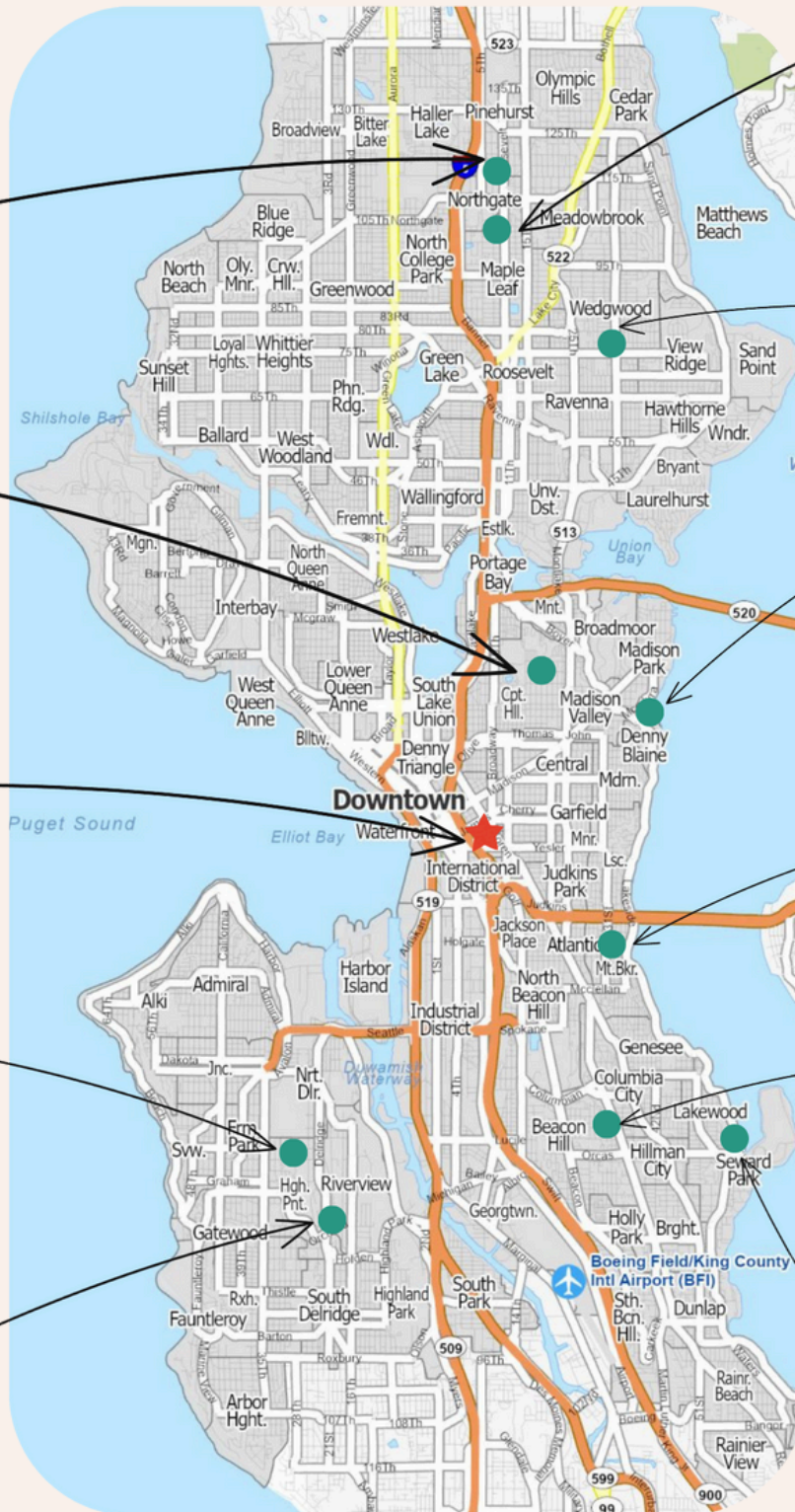

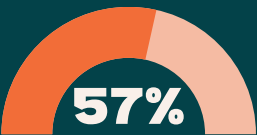

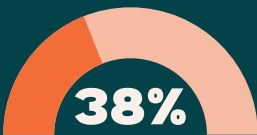
